## **Recommended Actions:**

- (a) Adopt attached resolution ratifying Carpinteria-Summerland Fire Protection District's Ordinance 2022-01 (adopting and amending the 2022 California Fire Code and Appendices and amending Section R313 of the 2022 California Residential Code) (Attachment A);
- (b) Upon ratification of the Ordinance, instruct the Clerk of the Board to forward a copy of the Board's ratifying Resolution, and the Carpinteria-Summerland Fire Protection District's Ordinance (including CSFPD's findings which are set forth in Section 8 of the Ordinance), to the California Department of Housing and Community Development, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 13869.7; and
- (c) Determine that the adoption of the Resolution is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act in compliance with Section 15061(b)(3) (no possibility of impact on the environment).

#### **Summary Text:**

The Carpinteria-Summerland Fire Protection District (CSFPD) has adopted by ordinance, building standards relating to fire and panic safety that are more stringent then those adopted by the State Fire Marshal and contained in the 2022 California Fire Code. CSFPD has also amended Section R313 of the 2022 California Residential Code. No ordinance adopted by a fire protection district shall be effective unless ratified by the County where the ordinance will apply. The Board may ratify, modify or deny any such ordinance.

## **Background:**

On November 2, 2022, CSFPD adopted Ordinance No. 2022-01 which adopted and amended the 2022 California Fire Code and amended Section R313 of the 2022 California Residential Code. The amendments made related to: prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire, hazardous materials or explosion; adopting by reference the Carpinteria-Summerland Fire Protection District development standards; providing for the issuance of permits for hazardous uses or operations; establishing a bureau of fire prevention and providing officers therefore and defining their powers and duties within the district; and amending Section R313 of the 2022 California Residential Code. These amendments are more restrictive then the requirements contained in the State Codes.

Health and Safety Code Section 13869.7 provides that a fire protection district may adopt building standards relating to fire and panic safety that are more stringent than those building standards adopted by the State Fire Marshal. More stringent building standards are contained in CSFPD's Ordinance No. 2022-01. CSFPD's findings are in section 8 of the Ordinance.

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 13869.7, CSFPD has forwarded Ordinance 2022-01 to the County and has requested ratification by the Board of Supervisors. (November 4, 2022 Letter and Ordinance No. 2022-01 are attached). The Board may ratify, modify or deny the adopted ordinance and transmit its determination to CSFPD within 15 days of its determination. Any modification or denial of an adopted ordinance shall include a written statement describing the reasons for any modifications or denial. CSFPD's Ordinance is not effective unless ratified by the Board of Supervisors.

Copies of the Ordinance were provided to the County on or about November 4, 2022. No written comments were returned to CSFPD.

#### **Special Instructions:**

- (a) Transmit a copy of the resolution to Carpinteria-Summerland Fire Protection District within 15 days of its adoption.
- (b) Upon ratification of the Ordinance, instruct staff to forward a copy of the Board's ratifying Resolution and the District's Ordinance (which includes the findings set forth in section 8), to the California Department of Housing and Community Development, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 13869.7.
