As requested by your Board, the Geropsychiatric Services Project Team was formalized at a meeting on September 22, 2003. A list of the members is included.

Cottage Hospital reported that they have decided not to develop a Geropsychiatric Unit at Goleta Valley Cottage Hospital at this time. They stated the primary reason is not for financial reasons but because of space. The Transitional Care Unit (TCU) was being studied as a place to establish a Geropsychiatric Unit. However, the Medical/Surgical patient population is increasing and the TCU space is needed for Medical/Surgical patients. Also, the TCU area is needed to re-locate some services during their State required retrofitting.

A Project Charter was approved (copy included) and a general consensus was reached for all to work collaboratively toward broader services and resources to prevent hospitalization of the elderly. The next meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 10, 2003. Quarterly reports outlining actions taken and progress made will be submitted to your Board.
