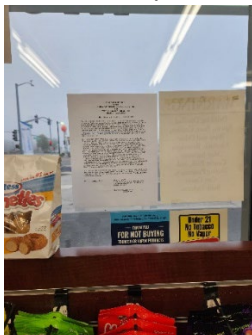

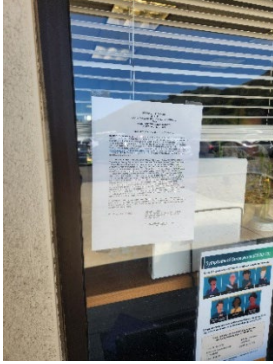

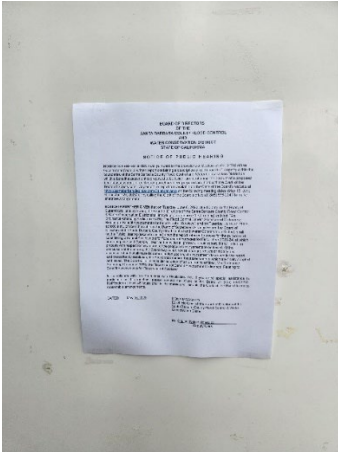


9. Guadalupe Flood Zone

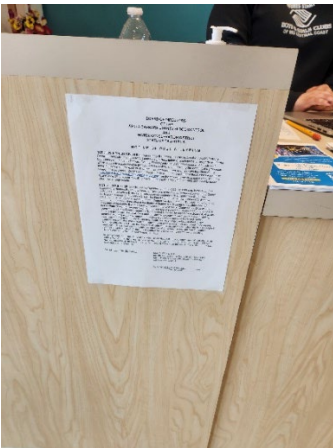

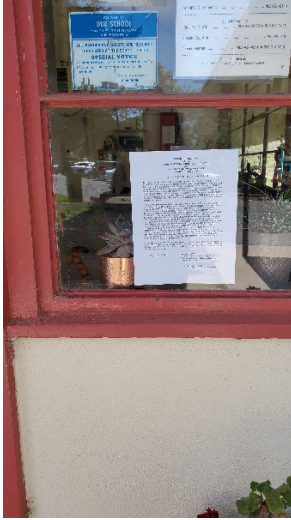

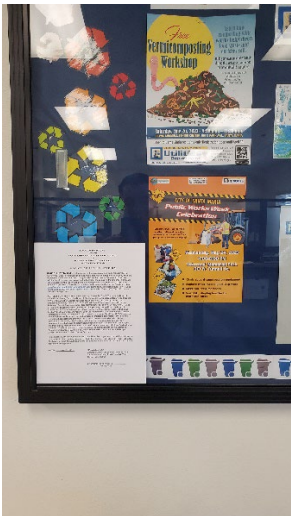


