Where expenditure would or could exceed \$25,000, procurement may be authorized only after approval by the Board. Public Works is requesting that the Board procure aggregate materials due to the cost of these items having exceeded the amount at which the Purchasing Agent. The authorization is not for sole source purchases, but allows the Public Works Department to expedite the purchase of material from vendors without the \$25,000 limit. The term project refers to the general policy making activity which is being approved and which may be subject to several discretionary approvals by governmental agencies. The term project does not mean each separate governmental approval. Further, the request to adopt a Resolution will not create any unusual circumstances which would create a possibility that there would be a significant effect.
