Summary Text:

The attached ITAM-0550 Acceptable Use Policy was approved by the Executive Information Technology Council (EITC) on April 23, 2025. This policy serves as a foundational document, providing essential guidance on the appropriate use of the County's information technology assets. It is designed to ensure the integrity, security, and availability of these resources for all authorized users. While not required to be presented to your Board, it is being shared today for informational purposes.

Discussion:

The ITAM-0550 Acceptable Use Policy, approved by the EITC on April 23, 2025, underwent the meetand-confer process prior to its adoption. This policy establishes clear expectations for the responsible use of County IT resources and is critical to safeguarding those resources. It is intended to protect the County and its stakeholders, including employees, contractors, volunteers, and the public—by defining acceptable behaviors and practices in the use of County technology systems.

Background:

The EITC was established to provide strategic oversight and governance for the County's IT investments. A key component of this governance structure is the Information Technology Policy Committee, which is responsible for developing and maintaining the County's official IT policies. The Board of Supervisors has delegated authority to the EITC for final review and approval of IT policies recommended by the committee. While EITC holds this authority, it may occasionally opt to present a policy to the Board for informational or strategic review.
