#### RECOMENDATION

- Receive and accept a status report on the County's review of the University of California, Santa Barbara's (UCSB) Long Range Development Plan (LRDP) Draft **Environmental Impact Report (DEIR).**
- Provide direction to staff to prepare and submit comments regarding the DEIR by the June 23, 2008 deadline



- THE "ACADEMIC PLAN"
  - Establishes the Campus Growth
    - 1% per year to 2025
    - 25,000 students
- THE LONG RANGE DEVELOPMENT PLAN (LRDP)
  - The Campus General Plan
    - Implements the Academic Plan through appropriate land uses and growth related to the population
- DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT (DEIR)
  - Required pursuant to CEQA
  - Coastal Commission is the approving body

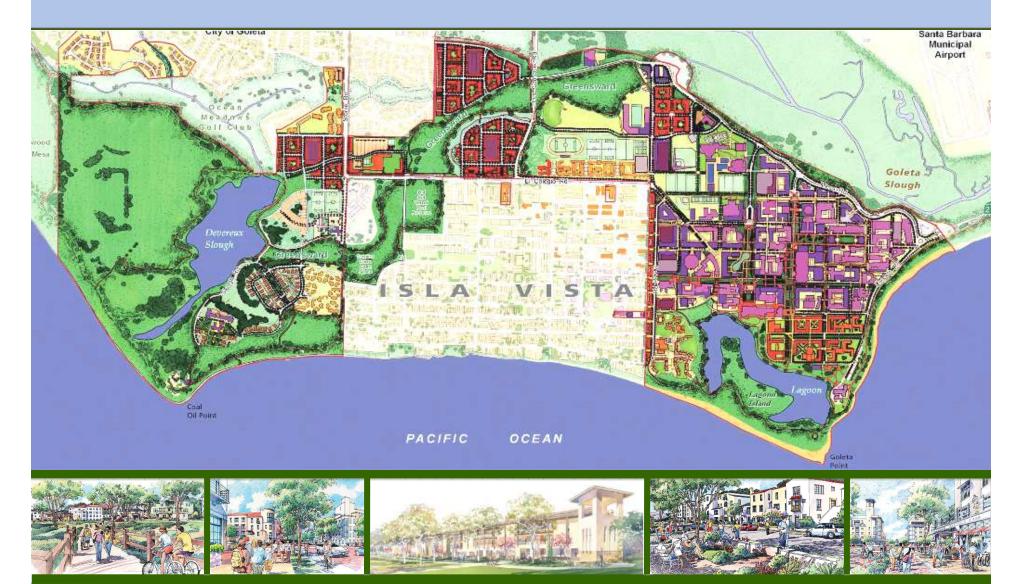














OFFICE OF LONG RANGE PLANNING

  - Released March 20, 2008
  - 90 Day Comment Period
    - Ends Monday, June 23, 2008
- INTERDEPARTMENTAL REVIEW COMPLETED
  - County Executive Office, Fire, Sheriff, Public Works (Traffic, Solid Waste, Water Resources), Planning and Development, Parks, and County Counsel
- FISCAL IMPACT ANALYSIS COMPLETED
  - Analysis conducted by Economic Planning Systems











## DEIR COMMENT SUMMARY

- Aesthetics
  - Height increases up to 80 feet
- Air Quality
  - Increase in peak hour trips
- Biology
  - Development adjacent to Environmentally Sensitive Habitat Areas (ESHA)
  - Construction impacts and subsequent uses will need to be mitigated



## **DEIR COMMENT SUMMARY CONT'D**

- Cultural Resources
  - Demolition of existing structures of potential historic merit
- Geology
  - Fault lines cross the campus, which may change LRDP campus design
  - Seawall may be needed on east facing bluffs



# DEIR COMMENT SUMMARY CONT'D

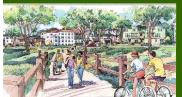
- Hydrology & Water Quality
  - Increase in run-off from developed areas into existing impaired waterways

#### - Hazards

- Increase in the need and handling of hazardous materials
- Greater need for coordination with County to ensure the safety of students, faculty, staff and County residents.

#### Noise

- Noise levels may potentially increase due to LRDP growth
- Noise resulting from construction and use should be consistent with the Biology section











## **DEIR COMMENT SUMMARY CONT'D**

- Population & Housing
  - The proposed growth and redevelopment could impact strained housing stock if not constructed in proper phases
  - The secondary growth and continuing students may also impact housing stock



- DEIR COMMENT SUMMARY CONT'D
  - Public Services
    - County Fire service will be impacted
    - County Law Enforcement will be further impacted



## DEIR COMMENT SUMMARY CONT'D

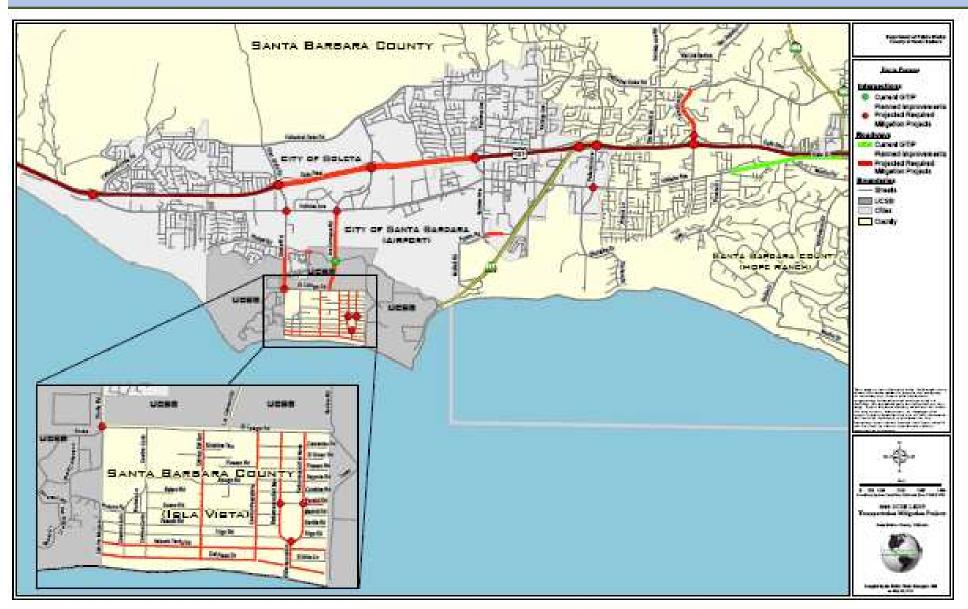
#### Recreation

 Increased growth will result in increased use of Goleta Beach and surrounding trails and bike paths

## Transportation

- Increases in peak hour trips would necessitate roadway improvements in the area
- This would resulting from cumulative growth and project specific growth

# DEIR COMMENT SUMMARY CONT'D

- Water Supply & Waste Water
  - Increased growth will exceed UCSB water allotment
  - UCSB will need to secure additional water
  - Current waste water capacity can accommodate the proposed growth

#### Other Facilities

- Demolition, construction and build-out related solid waste will result in an significant amount of waste.
- Diversion rates consistent with the County should be implemented



### DEIR COMMENT SUMMARYCONT'D

#### Alternatives

 Alternatives that address regional issues, such as housing, public services and traffic should be addressed.

#### Other CEQA Considerations

- Additional jobs, indirect LRDP growth will impact existing jobs housing balance
- Assembly Bill 32, Greenhouse Gas Bill



## FISCAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Analysis of UCSB fiscal impacts
  - Economic Planning Systems (EPS) study evaluated the following:
    - Services Provided
    - Funding Sources
    - Capital Improvements
    - UCSB "Tax Exempt" status

#### EPS STUDY

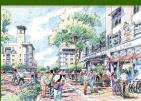
- Public Services operating at a deficit
  - Currently \$5.0 Million annually
  - LRDP Build out of \$9.3 Million annually
- Required Infrastructure Needs
  - Will exceed \$132 Million













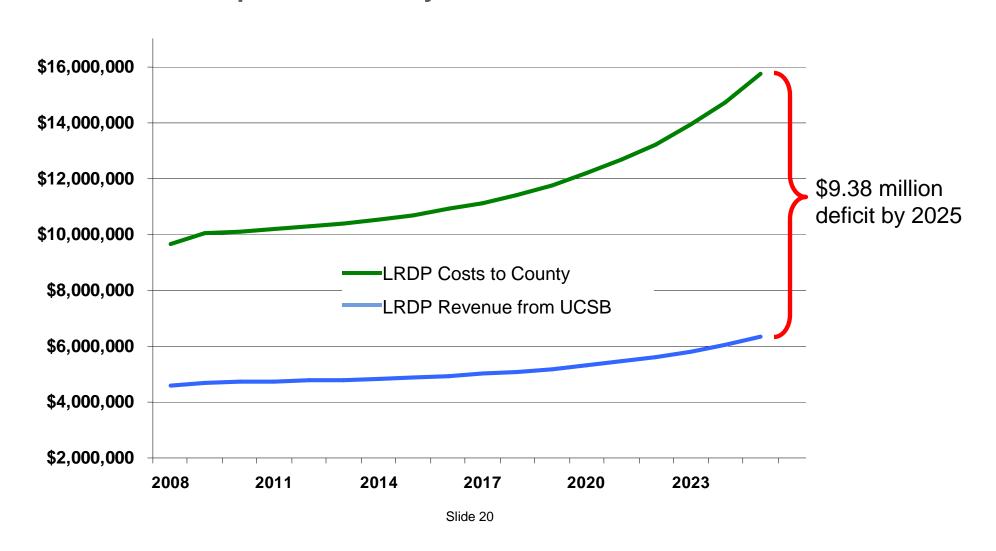
