SUBJECT: Promoting Safe and Stable Families Program, Revised Budget for 2004-05

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Adopt a resolution approving the Revised Budget for 2004-05 for the Promoting Safe and Stable (PSSF) Program of Santa Barbara County.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan: The recommendation(s) are primarily aligned with Goal 7: "A community that fosters the safety and well-being of families and children".

Executive Summary and Discussion:

On May 7, 2002 the Board of Supervisors approved a <u>Three Year Plan and Budget for the Promoting Safe</u> and Stable Families Program ("PSSF") for 2002-03 to 2004-05 in Santa Barbara County, as proposed by the Department of Social Services, with the KIDS Network Policy Council as the PSSF steering committee and the KIDS Network Advisory Committee as the community advisory body. At that time, the Board requested that the Department return in 2003, 2004 and 2005 with PSSF Budgets when each year's PSSF allocation amounts are received from the State.

In County Fiscal Letter 04/05-06 dated August 11, 2004, the California Department of Social Services advised that our county's PSSF Program allocation for 2004-05 had been increased as a result of the federal 2004 Budget Act. Santa Barbara County's 2004-05 allocation was increased to \$535,769. This amount represents an increase of 24% over the prior fiscal year.

The attached <u>Revised PSSF Budget for 2004-05</u> includes a description of how funds will be used without reductions to any of the existing commitments to the Family Support contracts which help support our county's Healthy Start programs. After approving this budget on September 1, 2004, the KIDS Network

Policy Council has proposed that a committee be formed to review federal requirements and Santa Barbara County's PSSF allocation distribution in order to make recommendations for the next three year plan and budget to be developed beginning in April 2005.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

For the fiscal year 2004-05, Santa Barbara County has received a \$535,769 Title IV-B federal PSSF allocation from the California Department of Social Services, representing an increase of \$104,524 over the prior year. These funds and their associated appropriations have been included in the budget adjustment submitted to the Board by the Department of Social Services on November 9, 2004. There is no impact on the County General Fund.

BUDGET NARRATIVE: The California Department of Social Services issued County Fiscal Letter No. 04/05-06 on August 11, 2004 announcing 2004-05 SFY allocations. Last year this funding was shifted from a Federal to a State Fiscal Year basis. The allocation for Santa Barbara County is \$535,769. DSS overhead is limited to 10% of the total allocation. At least 20% of the remaining funds must be allocated to each of four categories: Family Preservation Services; Family Support Services; Adoption Promotion and Support; and Time-Limited Family Reunification. This federal requirement began in 2002-03, and KIDS has been working for the past two years toward achieving this goal while at the same time maintaining the existing funding base for the contracted agencies providing Family Support Services.
