To the County Board of Supervisors,

As a Santa Barbara resident, and an engaged community member, I fully support Supervisors Capps and Lee, regarding Special Agenda Item 1 - number 26-00347. As they wrote in the recent article in the *Independent*, "This is not about partisanship. It is about standing up for our community. It is about ensuring that public spaces remain safe, that our elections remain free, and that local voices matter."

The three-part policy that they are proposing will help protect the use of county property from federal immigration enforcement, will safeguard elections, and help maintain local control over land-use decisions like the building of detention centers.

I agree that it is unacceptable when our public institutions — our colleges, our service centers, our parking lots, our community spaces — are used as launch points for operations that sow fear and chaos. I personally witnessed an ICE encounter a couple of months ago on the corner of Santa Barbara and Cabrillo Streets where an elderly citizen was thrown to the ground. It was frightening and sickening to see people treated in such a manner. Such actions send the chilling message that nowhere is safe.

Additionally, I am very concerned about safeguarding our election process. Voters must be assured that it is safe to vote, that our voices are heard, and our ballots, once they are cast, are protected. The proposal would strengthen poll monitoring, expand civic participation, and ensure that clear "Know Your Rights" voter information will be widely available.

Finally, the county should evaluate its authority to prohibit the siting, expansion, or operation of immigration detention or enforcement facilities in unincorporated Santa Barbara County. If such proposals arise, our community deserves a voice. People are protesting the conditions in existing detention centers, and the establishment of new ones, all across our country. These facilities operate without transparency, without a sense of humanity, or accountability.

It is clear that a significant portion of our community is already adversely affected directly by these issues, and indirectly all of us would be affected, with threats to our civil rights, general safety and sense of security.

You have jurisdiction over our county and as our leaders, and with support of this proposal, you can send a strong message to your constituents, that you will do all that you can to protect our community and our values.
