Summary



- June 15, 2016 BOS approved moving forward
- ARRC 2.0 is a collaborative program and is moving from monitoring centers to enhanced treatment models
- Lompoc and Santa Barbara enhanced treatment, moved from 3 to 5 days of service on August 2, and September 13, 2016
- Santa Maria will enhance treatment and move from 3 to 5 days of service on October 11, 2016

Goals



- Increase total operating hours and attendance
- Enhance services in Lompoc
- Increase treatment services
- Decrease use of maximum security beds
- Focus on assessment, case planning, and service delivery rather than community service work.

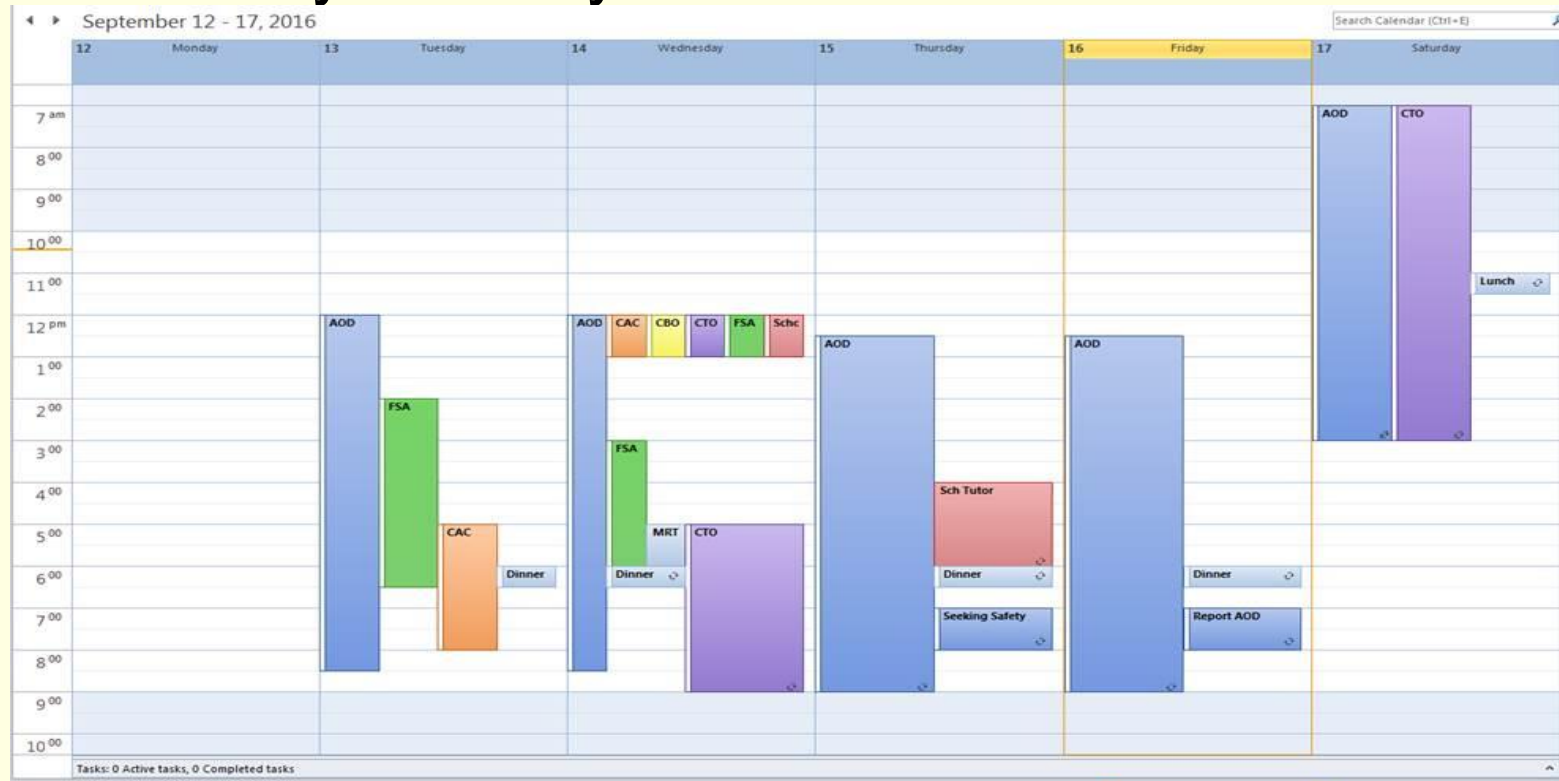
