



Statement of Enforcement of Local Rabies Control Activities

This Statement of Enforcement of Rabies Control Activities is for the declared "Rabies Endemic Area" indicated below, and effective January 1, 2014:

In accordance with Section 121585 and 121690 of the California Health and Safety Code, and upon the declaration of the Director of Public Health that all California counties are "Rabies Areas," the following statutory and regulatory programs must have continued enforcement in your jurisdiction. The owner of every dog over the age of four months shall ensure that his/her dog is currently vaccinated for rabies, unless granted an exemption by the local health officer, as a requisite for mandatory licensure. Dogs less than four months of age shall be confined at home or kept under close leash supervision by the owner. Rabies control programs must be established and include an animal shelter system, animal bite reporting and investigations, stray animal control, animal rabies case investigation, quarantine of biting dogs and cats, quarantine of domestic animals potentially exposed to rabies, and other activities for the purpose of carrying out and enforcing the provisions of the California Rabies Control Program. The local governing body shall provide or arrange for "actual cost" canine rabies vaccination clinics. The "actual cost" vaccination fee approved by the Department for 2014 is \$6.00 per dog.
