

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE
COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

**IN THE MATTER OF ESTABLISHING STOP)
CONTROLS ON VARIOUS COUNTY ROADS) RESOLUTION NO. _____
IN THE THIRD SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT)**

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code Section 21101(b) and the Code of Santa Barbara County, California, Section 23-1, authorize the Board of Supervisors of the County, to designate portions of roads and highways under its jurisdiction as a stop intersection; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of public safety that certain portions of County highways in Santa Barbara County be designated as Stop Intersections, in accordance with said Sections:

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that the following locations in Santa Barbara County and under the jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors of said County are hereby designated as Stop Intersections, and that the Director of Public Works of the County of Santa Barbara is hereby authorized and directed to install and maintain appropriate pavement markings and signs at the following locations.

One-Way Stop Control

- Cuesta Street at its intersection with Willow Street
- Burnham Drive at its intersection with St. Andrews Way
- Pinehurst Drive at its intersection with St. Andrews Way

Two-Way Stop Control

- Cota Street at its intersection with Sagunto Street

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Santa Barbara County Director of Public Works or designee is hereby authorized and directed to install appropriate markings and/or signs at said locations as time and resources permit.
