## RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

IN THE MATTER OF RE-RATIFYING	
PROCLAMATION OF THE EXISTENCE	
OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY CAUSED BY	7
DROUGHT CONDITIONS	

WHEREAS, Government Code, Sections 8558 and 8630, et seq., and Chapter 12 of the Santa Barbara County Code empower the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when the County is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the Board of Supervisors is not in session, subject to ratification by the Board of Supervisors within seven days; and

WHEREAS, drought conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within this County; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services of the County of Santa Barbara did proclaim the existence of a Local Emergency Caused by Drought Conditions within Santa Barbara County on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 2014, at 2:00 p.m., at which time the Board of Supervisors was not in session; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 21, 2014 the Board of Supervisors found that conditions of extreme peril warranted and necessitated the ratification of the Proclamation of Local Emergency Caused by Drought Conditions; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 8630(c) requires the Board of Supervisors to review the need for the continued existence of a Proclamation of Local Emergency at least every 30 days and Government Code Section 8630(d) requires termination of a Proclamation of Local Emergency at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant; and

WHEREAS, drought conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property in Santa Barbara County persist, and warrant the ongoing Proclamation of Local Emergency Caused by Drought; and

WHEREAS, Santa Barbara County still remains at the D1 Drought level of Moderate; and

WHEREAS, reliance on the State water system as the primary source of water for many parts of the County leaves the County vulnerable to a water outages and shortages; and

WHERAS, winter storms have impacted the County and have triggered significant inflow into Lake Cachuma in recent weeks that has not been seen in several years. The inflow has increased the capacity to nearly 51% (from a low of near 7%). This percent capacity was last seen in August of 2013 just prior to the County proclaiming a drought emergency. As of April 12, 2017, Cachuma's storage was at approximately 98,000 acre-feet; and

WHEREAS, in 2015 the level of Lake Cachuma fell below the level needed for water to flow unassisted into Tecolote Tunnel, the conduit that delivers water to the South Coast. A pump barge facility was installed to pump water to Tecolote Tunnel. With the recent rise in the level of Lake Cachuma, water is again flowing unassisted into Tecolote Tunnel, and the pump barge has been removed; and

WHEREAS, there have been a number of construction issues that have delayed the opening of the City of Santa Barbara's Desalination facility. The facility is now projected to go online in May. It will produce nearly 3 million gallons per day, which is equivalent to 3,125 acre-feet of water annually or about 30% of the City's demand; and

WHEREAS, a Drought Action Working Group was formed at the request of the State Drought Task Force. A majority of the local water agencies participated in the Drought Action Working Group; it was facilitated by the Santa Barbara County Office of Emergency Management. The Drought Action Working Group identified projects which address the immediate drought emergency and projects that address the sustainability of our long-term water supply. This project list has been forwarded to the State Drought Task Force. Staff will continue to work with the State Drought Task Force and local water agencies, to fund and implement these projects; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that the conditions warranting the Proclamation of Local Emergency Caused by Drought Conditions continue to exist and the Proclamation of the Local Emergency Caused by Drought Conditions shall remain in place; and

**IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED** that the Local Emergency Caused by Drought Conditions will be terminated at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant.
