

SUBJECT: 2009 Amendments to the 'Santa Barbara County Single Comprehensive Conflict of Interest Code for County Departments, Commissions/Boards/Committees and Dependent Special Districts' (Single Code)

Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors adopt by resolution the 2009 Amendments to the 'Santa Barbara County Single Comprehensive Conflict of Interest Code for County Departments, Commissions/Boards/Committees and Dependent Special Districts' (Single Code). The 2009 Amendments:

1. Update the positions that are required to report and/or the disclosure categories for the public officials associated with the various County Agencies that are currently included in the Single Code, and renumber the exhibit references for the Boards of Architectural Review; and
2. Add the South Coast Homeless Advisory Committee to the Single Code.

Summary Text:

Every state and local government agency is required to adopt a "conflict of interest code". Government Code Section 87300. A conflict of interest code designates the positions within an agency

that “involve the making or participation in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest” of the public official. Government Code Section 87302(a). The designated public officials must periodically disclose certain investments, interests in real property, sources of income, gifts, loans and business positions. The financial disclosures are compiled on Form 700 as required by the Fair Political Practices Act. Government Code Sections 81000 et.seq. Agencies must amend their conflict of interest codes when necessary to add or delete positions and disclosure categories. Conflict of interest codes must be reviewed at least every two years.

On October 3, 1995, the Board of Supervisors directed the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor to adopt a conflict of interest code for county departments, commissions/boards/committees and dependent special districts – the ‘Santa Barbara County Single Comprehensive Conflict of Interest Code for County Departments, Commissions/Boards/Committees and Dependent Special Districts’ (Single Code). (Resolution No. 95-450). The Single Code was adopted by the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor on December 5, 1995. The Single Code is intended to help ensure timely amendments and revisions. Additionally, all financial disclosure statements (Form 700’s) are filed in the Office of the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor, which provides a central repository for public access. The Board of Supervisors is the “code reviewing body” for the Single Code. Government Code Section 87303.

The Board of Supervisors has approved several amendments to the Single Code, which have added and deleted agencies, and revised the list of designated positions and disclosure categories.

The 2009 Amendments to the Single Code, which are part of the required biennial review, are summarized as follows:

- (1) Amendments affecting existing members of the Single Code:
 - a) Exhibit No. C-1/A-SBAR (South Board of Architectural Review) for the purpose of renumbering the Exhibit reference;
 - b) Exhibit No. C-1/B-CBAR (Central Board of Architectural Review) for the purpose of renumbering the Exhibit reference;
 - c) Exhibit No. C-1/C-NBAR (North Board of Architectural Review) for the purpose of renumbering the Exhibit reference;
 - d) Exhibit No. C-1/D-MBAR (Montecito Board of Architectural Review) for the purpose of renumbering from Exhibit C-19.
 - e) Exhibit No. C-3 (Santa Barbara County Housing & Community Development) for the purpose of renaming existing positions and deleting an abolished position;
 - f) Exhibit No. C-6 (Santa Barbara County Child Support Services) for the purpose of deleting titles to positions that have been abolished and deleting titles to positions that do not make governmental decisions;
 - g) Exhibit No. C-7 (Santa Barbara County Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights and Measures; Cooperative Extension, University of California) for the purpose designating new positions and deleting abolished positions;
 - h) Exhibit No. C-9 (Santa Barbara County Auditor-Controller) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions;
 - i) Exhibit No. C-12 (Santa Barbara County Clerk, Recorder-Assessor) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions;
 - j) Exhibit No. C-14 (Santa Barbara County District Attorney) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions;

- k) Exhibit No. C-16 (Santa Barbara County General Services) for the purpose of deleting titles of positions that have been abolished;
- l) Exhibit No. C-19 is intentionally left unassigned – now see Exhibit C-1D/MBAR for the Montecito Board of Architectural Review;
- m) Exhibit No. C-25 (Santa Barbara County Human Resources Department) for the purpose of designating new positions and revising the titles of existing positions;
- n) Exhibit No. C-27 (Santa Barbara County Planning and Development Department) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions and deleting titles of positions that have been abolished or are no longer in use;
- o) Exhibit No. C-32 (Santa Barbara County Social Services Department) for the purpose of designating new positions and revising the titles of existing positions;
- p) Exhibit No. C-33 (Santa Barbara County Treasurer-Tax Collector-Public Administrator) for the purpose of designating new positions and deleting titles of existing positions that are mandatory reporters under Government Code Section 87200;
- q) Exhibit No. C-36 (In-Home Care Network, Santa Barbara county Public Authority) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions;

(2) Amendment adding a new member to the Single Code:

- a) The South Coast Homeless Advisory Committee is added to the Single Code as set forth in Exhibit No. C-40.

All other provisions of the Single Code that are not addressed in these amendments, remain in effect.

Recitals

- a. Every state and local government agency is required to adopt a “conflict of interest code”. Government Code Section 87300. A conflict of interest code designates the positions within an agency that “involve the making or participation in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest” of the public official. Government Code Section 87302(a). The designated public officials must periodically disclose certain investments, interests in real property, sources of income, gifts, loans and business positions. The financial disclosures are compiled on Form 700 as required by the Fair Political Practices Act. Government Code Sections 81000 et.seq. Agencies must amend their conflict of interest codes when necessary to add or delete positions and disclosure categories, and the codes must be reviewed at least every two years.

- b. On October 3, 1995, the Board of Supervisors directed the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor to adopt a comprehensive conflict of interest code that would cover multiple agencies. (Resolution No. 95-450). On December 5, 1995 the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor adopted a comprehensive code for

County Departments, certain County related Commissions/Boards/Committees and Dependent Special Districts. This conflict of interest code became known as the "Single Code". The Single Code is intended to help ensure timely amendments and revisions. Additionally, all financial disclosure statements (Form 700's) are filed in the Office of the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor, which provides a central repository for public access. The Board of Supervisors is the "code reviewing body" for the Single Code. Government Code Section 87303.

c. As the code reviewing body, the Board of Supervisors has approved several amendments to the Single Code that were initially adopted by the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor. The amendments have added and deleted agencies, and revised the list of designated positions and disclosure categories.

d. The 2009 Amendments to the Single Code, are part of the required biennial review.

e. The attached 2009 Amendments to the Single Code were initially made by the individual member agencies and then adopted by the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor. The amendments impact the identity of designated positions, required reporting categories and some clerical revisions. These amendments also add the South Coast Homeless Advisory Committee as a new member of the Single Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND RESOLVED that:

1) The 2009 Amendments to the Single Code (Attachment A) which have been adopted by the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor are approved as 2009 amendment to Resolution No. 95-450.

2) All other provisions of Resolution 95-450, as periodically amended, that are not affected by this amendment remain in effect.



2009 AMENDMENTS
TO THE SANTA BARBARA COUNTY
SINGLE COMPREHENSIVE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE
FOR LOCAL AGENCIES (SINGLE CODE)

(1) The Political Reform Act, Government Code § 81000 et seq., requires state and local agencies to adopt and amend, as circumstances require, conflict of interest codes. A conflict of interest code designates the positions within an agency that “involve the making or participation in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest” of the public official. Government Code Section 87302(a). The designated public officials must periodically disclose certain investments, interests in real property, sources of income, gifts, loans and business positions. The financial disclosures are compiled on Form 700 as mandated by the Fair Political Practices Act. Agencies must amend their conflict of interest codes when necessary to add or delete positions and disclosure categories, and at a minimum a conflict of interest code must be reviewed every two years.

(2) On October 3, 1995, the Board of Supervisors directed the County Clerk-Recorder¹ to adopt a comprehensive conflict of interest code for county departments, certain county related commissions/boards/committees and dependent special districts. (Resolution No. 95-450). On December 5, 1995 the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor adopted a comprehensive conflict of interest code for multiple agencies. This conflict of interest code became known as the “Single Code”. The Single Code is intended to help ensure timely amendments and revisions. Additionally, all financial disclosure statements (Form 700’s) are filed in the Office of the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor, which provides a central repository for public access. The Board of Supervisors is the “code reviewing body” for the Single Code. Government Code Section 87303.

(3) There have been several amendments to the Single Code, which have added and/or deleted agencies, and revised the list of designated positions and disclosure categories. These amendments were first adopted by the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor and then approved by the Board of Supervisors as amendments to Resolution No. 95-450.

(4) The designated positions and/or the disclosure categories, or the exhibit number reference for the following Single Code participants are amended (the corresponding exhibits are attached):

- a) Exhibit No. C-1/A-SBAR (South Board of Architectural Review) for the purpose of renumbering the Exhibit reference;
- b) Exhibit No. C-1/B-CBAR (Central Board of Architectural Review) for the purpose of renumbering the Exhibit reference;
- c) Exhibit No. C-1/C-NBAR (North Board of Architectural Review) for the purpose of renumbering the Exhibit reference;

¹ Subsequently, the Clerk-Recorder was consolidated with the Assessor and is currently the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor.

- d) Exhibit No. C-1/D-MBAR (Montecito Board of Architectural Review) for the purpose of renumbering from Exhibit C-19.
- e) Exhibit No. C-3 (Santa Barbara County Housing & Community Development) for the purpose of renaming existing positions and deleting an abolished position;
- f) Exhibit No. C-6 (Santa Barbara County Child Support Services) for the purpose of deleting titles to positions that have been abolished and deleting titles to positions that do not make governmental decisions;
- g) Exhibit No. C-7 (Santa Barbara County Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights and Measures; Cooperative Extension, University of California) for the purpose designating new positions and deleting abolished positions;
- h) Exhibit No. C-9 (Santa Barbara County Auditor-Controller) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions;
- i) Exhibit No. C-12 (Santa Barbara County Clerk, Recorder-Assessor) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions;
- j) Exhibit No. C-14 (Santa Barbara County District Attorney) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions;
- k) Exhibit No. C-16 (Santa Barbara County General Services) for the purpose of deleting titles of positions that have been abolished;
- l) Exhibit No. C-19 is intentionally left unassigned – now see Exhibit C-1D/MBAR for the Montecito Board of Architectural Review;
- m) Exhibit No. C-25 (Santa Barbara County Human Resources Department) for the purpose of designating new positions and revising the titles of existing positions;
- n) Exhibit No. C-27 (Santa Barbara County Planning and Development Department) for the purpose of revising the titles of existing positions and deleting titles of positions that have been abolished or are no longer in use;
- o) Exhibit No. C-32 (Santa Barbara County Social Services Department) for the purpose of designating new positions and revising the titles of existing positions;
- p) Exhibit No. C-33 (Santa Barbara County Treasurer-Tax Collector-Public Administrator) for the purpose of designating new positions and deleting titles of existing positions that are mandatory reporters under Government Code Section 87200;



Victoria Street, Santa Barbara, California, or at such other location as is hereinafter designated by the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor.

(8) A copy of the Single Code maybe obtained at the Elections Division of the Office of the Clerk-Recorder-Assessor at 130 E. Victoria Street, Santa Barbara, California.

- b) Within the previous two years, the designated employee has made, participated in making, or in any way has attempted to use his or her official position to influence, the governmental decision to obtain or procure services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of the same or similar type as those provided or contracted to be provided to the County of Santa Barbara, or any incorporated City within said County or if the duties of the designated employee's positions make it reasonable foreseeable that he or she might engage in such activity.

Category 4

Business positions or investments in business entities and income from any source or sources of income, if

- c) The business entities or the source of sources of income are of the type which, within the previous two years, have furnished or contracted to furnish, or in the future with reasonable foreseeability might furnish or contract to furnish, supplies, material, machinery or equipment as a subcontractor in any contract with the County of Santa Barbara, or any incorporated City within said County to provide services, supplies, material, machinery or equipment to or for the use of the County of Santa Barbara, or any incorporated City within said County; and
- d) Within the previous two years, the designated employee has made, participated in making, or in any way has attempted to use his or her official position to influence, the governmental decision to obtain or procure services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of the same or similar type as those provided or contracted to be provided to the County of Santa Barbara, or any incorporated City within said County or if the duties of the designated employee's positions make it reasonable foreseeable that he or she might engage in such activity.

Category 5

Business positions or investments in business entities and income from any source or sources of income, if

- a) The business entities of the source or sources of income are of the type which are subject to the regulation or supervision of the County of Santa Barbara, or any incorporated City within said County; and
- b) The designated employee's duties involve the supervision or regulation (including but not limited to, the issuance or granting of franchises, building permits or other use or business permits or any other land use control or regulation) of that type of business entity or source of income.
