As CEO of the Linked Foundation located at 3749 Santa Claus Lane in Carpinteria, I am *vehemently opposed* to:

1. A Cannabis Retail store on Santa Claus Lane
2. Allowing a Coastal Development Permit to allow North Starr Holdings, California LLC to cultivate 14 acres of Cannabis at 3804, 3890 and 3892 Via Real, Carpinteria.

Re: The Retail Shop. As you probably know, Santa Claus Lane provides a healthy, safe and fun environment to our beach community.. with its surf shops, surfing camps and family-friendly dining (please note the Padaro Grill is a favorite for many young families).
