Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve, ratify, and authorize the Public Health Department Director to accept and receive a threeyear extension to the award from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), Award Number CERI-21-23-35 (Attachment A), in support of the California Equitable Recovery Initiative (CERI) being funded by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to address COVID-19 health disparities without change in the one-time funding amount of \$590,951 for the revised end date of May 31, 2026;
- b) Determine that the recommended action is not a "Project" with the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") and is exempt per CEQA Guideline section 15378(b)(4), since the recommended action is the creation of governmental funding mechanisms or other government fiscal activities which does not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda to authorize the Public Health Department to extend the term of a previously accepted funding allocation from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH). The California Equitable Recovery Initiative (CERI) was accepted by your board on March 15, 2022. The one-time funding amount of \$590,951 has been extended for three years through to the new date of May 31, 2026.

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The funding comes for the U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to support the Public Health Department's (PHD) health equity efforts countywide.

This allocation provides integral resources to local health jurisdictions in support of a broad range of COVID 19/SARS-CoV-2 response and recovery related activities. These allocations can be used for increase response capacity and staffing levels during the coronavirus-related public health emergency, to provide support for increased testing and disease containment, and to lay the foundation for future public health surveillance. The PHD will be using the funds to address health equity work, including COVID-19 related health disparities among underserved and high-risk populations, including racial and ethnic minority populations and rural communities.

Background:

The CDC, through CDPH, has made funds available to Local Health Jurisdictions (LHJs) as part of a historic U.S. response to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. PHD has used this award to build infrastructure to protect the community by using health equity-focused and community-driven strategies in preventing, testing for, and vaccinating against COVID-19 and related comorbidity factors that exacerbate negative health outcomes related to COVID-19 infections. PHD will utilize the funding extension to maintain, or increase, capacity and staffing to continue to address the necessary public health surveillance beyond the federal emergency period. Since the Coronavirus emergency response began, it was identified that LHJs would need additional resources in assisting communities in addressing the disease and responding to the pandemic.

Historically and contemporarily under-resourced communities suffer a disproportionate burden from negative health outcomes including disease, hospitalization, and death. The COVID-19 pandemic has exposed longstanding inequities that have systematically undermined the physical, social, economic, and emotional health of racial and ethnic minority populations and other population groups that bear an incommensurate burden of illness from the virus that causes COVID-19. Health equity work aims to identify and mitigate or eliminate barriers to care, which has the potential to improve overall population health in Santa Barbara County. These funds will be used for materials and consultants to provide PHD trainings that equip staff with knowledge and skills to better address health inequities that exist in Santa Barbara County.

Dedicated PHD Office of Health Equity staff not only execute projects, but also support and guide other departmental staff to incorporate health equity principals into their work. Examples of this work include expanding existing, or developing new mitigation and prevention resources and strategies to reduce COVID-19 related disparities among populations at higher risk for infection. Additionally, building, leveraging, and expanding infrastructure support for COVID-19 prevention and control among populations that are at higher risk and underserved.

The CERI activities described herein are supported by the CDC and Prevention of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) as part of a financial assistance award totaling \$590,951 with 100 percent funded by CDC/HHS.

PHD will provide progress reports to CDPH detailing the success of measurable objectives specified in the PHD already CDPH-approved Work Plan.
