Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the "Real Property Agreement; Secondary Use of Flood Control Land" with the City of Carpinteria, regarding a portion of Franklin Channel located on APN 004-011-044.

Summary Text:

M. Timm Construction is building homes on a parcel of land located adjacent to Franklin Channel (herein the "Channel") which Channel is owned in fee by the Santa Barbara County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (herein the "District"). The City of Carpinteria required the developer to install a pedestrian bridge across the Channel as a condition of construction approval for the above referenced homes. If approved the Real Property Agreement; Secondary Use of Flood Control Land (herein the "Agreement") will allow the installation of the bridge, indemnifies the District for use of the bridge, and acknowledges that the City of Carpinteria will be responsible for inspection and maintenance of the bridge. The location of the Channel and the pedestrian bridge are shown on Exhibit "A" attached to the Agreement.

The District has reviewed the developer's plans and has determined that installation of the pedestrian bridge will not impact their operations in or around the Channel. The Natural Resource Conservation Service also reviewed and approved the bridge plans.

Approval of the Agreement by the City of Carpinteria and your Board is necessary to comply with the District's Secondary Use Policy.

Background:

Franklin Channel was constructed in the 1970s after the Romero Fire by the United States Department of Agriculture, Natural Resource Conservation Service ("NRCS") as part of the Carpinteria Valley Watershed Protection Plan. Franklin Channel is one of several flood control projects built by the NRCS which are now owned and operated by the Flood Control District.

On July 7, 1998, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 98-266 that established a policy entitled "A Policy for Secondary Uses of Flood Control and Water Conservation Facilities for Bikeway and Recreational Purposes." That policy allows for the secondary use of flood control facilities. Execution of the Agreement indemnifies the District from any and all liability associated with secondary uses of the flood control facilities.

The District reviewed and approved plans for the pedestrian bridge prepared by Studio Engineering, Inc. and dated August 11, 2008.
