SUBJECT: City of Santa Maria Community Development Block Grant for FY 2006-07

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors execute a contract between the City of Santa Maria and Santa Barbara County for the County to provide shelter services for youth in the amount of \$6,000 for fiscal year 2006-07.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation(s) are primarily aligned with Goal No. 2. A Safe and Healthy Community in Which to Live, Work, and Visit and Goal No. 7. A Community that Fosters the Safety and Well-Being of Families and Children.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

The City of Santa Maria has granted the Probation Department \$6,000 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for fiscal year 2006-07 as partial payment for shelter care for runaway youth in Santa Maria. This \$6,000 will offset part of the cost for the Aspira/Moss Beach Homes agency, which provides shelter care under contract to the County.

In 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2005, the Board approved acceptance of CDBG funds from the City of Santa Maria to assist in funding the North County Youth Shelter program (NCYS). We were awarded \$16,200 for fiscal year 1999-00, \$14,000 for 2000-01, \$14,000 for 2001-02, \$14,000 for 2002-03, \$12,000 for 2003-04, \$12,000 for 2004-05, \$12,000 for 2005-06, and \$6,000 for 2006-07. For the fiscal year 2006-07, the Probation Department will fund the remaining \$24,470 estimated cost of the program. The Probation Department is requesting that the Board execute a contract for \$6,000 in CDBG funds with the City of Santa Maria for fiscal year 2006-07.

As has been shared with the Board previously, the NCYS program was initiated in October of 1998 to replace the youth shelter care program services being provided by Services for Adolescent & Family Enrichment (S.A.F.E.). The NCYS program serves minors and their families in the Santa Maria, Lompoc and Santa Ynez Valleys. It is designed to provide 24-hour crisis intervention, temporary shelter care placement, and appropriate follow-up counseling to facilitate family reunification for minors. The intent of the program is to resolve family crisis situations, keep families united, make referrals for appropriate family services, mitigate the problem of homeless youth, and divert minors from becoming wards of the court. In the past year it has served 65 youth and their families.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Although the specific provisions of shelter services and crisis intervention counseling are not mandated services, Sections 626 and 654 of the Welfare & Institutions Code authorize the Probation Officer to provide or contract for such services in lieu of filing Juvenile Court petitions on behalf of minors referred for violation of Section 601 of the W&I Code. The provision of such services is generally more cost effective and desirable than proceeding with formal Juvenile Court action (by diverting minors from becoming wards of the court).

Specific Probation Department Mandates are attached for your review.

Performance Measures:

To protect and serve the community and provide safe and secure treatment to youth: Ensure that at least 60% of 25 youth placed through the North County Youth Shelter program successfully return to home. During FY 2005-06, 64% of youth who were placed returned to a safe home.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The FY 2006-07 contribution of \$6,000 from the City of Santa Maria’s, Community Development Block Grant is part of the financing for the Probation Department’s North County Youth Shelter program. While \$12,000 was initially anticipated and included in the FY 2006-07 County Final Budget, the drop in funding from \$12,000 to \$6,000 should be more than offset by a corresponding decrease in the cost of services budgeted for the Aspira/Moss Beach Homes contract. The grant funding is shown as revenue in account #4789 (Federal-Other), and Program #2600 (Youth Shelters). There will be no increased cost to the County General Fund.
