Summary Text:

County Service Area 3 (CSA 3) was formed July 23, 1962 by Resolution No. 22409. CSA 3 boundaries cover portions of the unincorporated, urbanized area of the Goleta Valley between the cities of Goleta and Santa Barbara. CSA 3 provides for 1,390 streetlights, parks (Goleta Beach County Park and Tucker's Grove County Park) and open space maintenance, as well as enhanced library services. The Department proposes no change to the existing benefit assessment in fiscal year 09/10. With this action, CSA 3 will continue to have a benefit assessment rate of \$8 per residential parcel, \$4 for undeveloped parcels and multiples of \$8 for commercial or multiple residential units. Traditionally, benefit assessments were used to fully fund streetlighting costs; however, the rate was reduced from \$24 per residential parcel to the current \$8 amount in 1994 in order to reduce reserves. Therefore, \$121,728 of the \$725,000 in CSA 3 property tax revenue will be used to supplement the \$66,472 in benefit assessment revenue to fully fund streetlighting services, which are estimated to cost \$188,200 next year.

Because revenue from benefit assessments remain fixed, electricity rate increases from Southern California Edison (SCE) requires the property tax contribution to increase. SCE rates have increased over 55% since 2006.

Background:

Streetlighting services are provided by the county in unincorporated territory identified as county service areas pursuant to the Government Code or streetlighting districts pursuant to the Streets and Highways Code. County service areas may also provide additional services. Streetlighting systems are installed by development as conditions of approval pursuant to Resolution 81-229 and County Engineering Design Standards. The poles and fixtures are generally owned and maintained by the electric company (PG& E in the north county and Edison in the south county). Revenue to fund electric and maintenance costs billed monthly by the electric companies is generated through property taxes and benefit assessments. A benefit assessment is a levy or charge by an agency upon real property that is based upon the special benefit conferred upon the real property by a public improvement or service that is imposed to pay the capital cost of the public improvement, the maintenance and operation expenses of the public improvement, or the cost of the service being provided. This action addresses the adoption of a benefit assessment to supplement revenue for streetlighting services.

Performance Measure:

No change in programs or service level if the benefit assessment rates are established for FY 2009-2010 for County Service Area 3. A drastic reduction in revenue would result if the rates were not established.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

There is no recommended increase to the existing benefit assessment rates for County Service Area 3. Property tax revenue will be used to supplement benefit assessment revenue in order to meet the anticipated streetlighting budget for FY 2009-2010. The remainder of the property tax revenue generated for CSA 3 will be used for services provided by other departments as authorized by LAFCO.
