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RESOLUTION 2011/2012-14 SANTA YNEZ VALLEY UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA YNEZ VALLEY UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT ORDERING AN ELECTION TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF SCHOOL BONDS, ESTABLISHING SPECIFICATIONS OF THE ELECTION ORDER, AND REQUESTING CONSOLIDATION WITH OTHER ELECTIONS OCCURRING ON NOVEMBER 6, 2012

- WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Santa Ynez Valley Union High School District (the "District"), it is advisable to call an election to submit to the electors of the District the question whether bonds of the District shall be issued and sold for the purpose of raising money for the acquisition or improvement of real property, and the furnishing and equipping of school facilities; and
- WHEREAS, as a result of the approval of Proposition 39 on November 7, 2000, Article XIII A, Section 1, paragraph (b), of the California Constitution ("Article XIII A") provides an exception to the limit on *ad valorem* property taxes on real property for bonded indebtedness incurred by a school district approved by 55 percent of the voters of the district voting on the proposition; and
- WHEREAS, the Board is specifically authorized, upon approval by a two-thirds vote of the Board, to pursue the authorization and issuance of bonds by a fifty-five percent (55%) vote of the electorate on the question whether bonds of the District shall be issued and sold for specified purposes, pursuant to Education Code Section 15264 et seq. (the "Act"); and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to the California Elections Code, it is appropriate for the Board to request consolidation of the election with any and all other elections to be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2012, and to request the Santa Barbara County Registrar of Voters to perform certain election services for the District; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of the Santa Ynez Valley Union High School District the following:

- Section 1. Call for Election. The Board hereby orders an election and submits to the electors of the District the question of whether general obligation bonds of the District shall be issued and sold in the maximum principal amount of \$19,840,000 for the purpose of raising money to finance school facilities and property of the District, and paying costs incident thereto, as set forth more fully in the ballot proposition approved pursuant to Section 3. This Resolution constitutes the order of the District to call such election.
- **Section 2.** Election Date. The date of the election shall be November 6, 2012, and the election shall be held solely within the boundaries of the District.
- Section 3. Purpose of Election; Ballot Proposition. The purpose of the election shall be for the voters in the District to vote on a proposition, a full copy of which is

attached hereto and marked Exhibit A, containing the question of whether the District shall issue the Bonds for the purpose stated therein, together with the accountability requirements of Article XIII A and Government Code Section 53410 and the requirements of Section 15272 of the Act. The Santa Barbara County Registrar of Voters (the "County Registrar") is requested to print the Full Text of Measure contained on Exhibit A, including Exhibit A-1 in the sample ballot pamphlet. As required by Elections Code Section 13247, the abbreviated form of the measure to appear on the ballot is attached hereto and marked as Exhibit B. The Superintendent or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to make any changes to the text of the proposition or this resolution as required to conform to any requirements of Article XIII A, the Act, or the Santa Barbara County Registrar of Voters.

- Section 4. Authority for Election. The authority for ordering the election is contained in Section 15264 *et. seq.* of the Education Code and Section I, paragraph (b), subsection (3), of Article XIII A. The authority for the specification of this election order is contained in Section 5322 of the Education Code.
- **Section 5. School Facilities Projects**. As required by Article XIII A, the Board hereby certifies that it has evaluated safety, class size reduction, enrollment growth, and information technology needs in developing the list of school facilities projects set forth on Exhibit A-1.
- Section 6. Covenants of the Board upon Approval of the Bonds by the Electorate. As required by Article XIII, Section 15278 of the Act, and Government Code Section 53410, in the event 55 percent of the voters voting in the District approve of the Bonds, the Board shall:
 - conduct an annual, independent performance audit to ensure that the funds have been expended only on the projects listed in Exhibit A-1:
 - conduct an annual, independent financial audit of the proceeds from the sale of the Bonds until all of those proceeds have been expended for the school facilities projects listed in Exhibit A-1;
 - establish and appoint members to an independent citizens' oversight committee in accordance with Sections 15278, 15280, and 15282 of the Act;
 - 4. apply the bond proceeds only to the specific purposes stated in the ballot proposition;
 - 5. cause creation of accounts into which bond proceeds shall be deposited; and
 - 6. cause the preparation of an annual report pursuant to Government Code Sections 53410 and 53411.
- Section 7. Delivery of this Resolution. The Clerk of the Board is hereby directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the Santa Barbara County Superintendent of

Schools, the County Registrar and the Santa Barbara County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

- **Section 8. Consolidation of Election**. The County Registrar and the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors are hereby requested to consolidate the election ordered hereby with any and all other elections to be held on November 6, 2012, within the District.
- Section 9. Ballot Arguments; Tax Rate Statement. Any and all members of this Board are hereby authorized to act as an author of any ballot argument prepared in connection with the election, including a rebuttal argument. The Superintendent, President of the Board, or their designees, are hereby authorized to execute any Tax Rate Statement or other document and to perform all acts necessary to place the bond measure on the ballot.
- Section 10. Elections Code. Pursuant to Section 5303 of the Education Code and Section 10002 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of Santa Barbara County, is requested to permit the Registrar of Voters to render all services specified by Section 10418 of the Elections Code relating to the election, for which services the District agrees to reimburse Santa Barbara County in full upon presentation of a bill, such services to include the mailing of the sample ballot and tax rate statement (described in Section 9401 of the Elections Code).

Section 11. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect on and after its adoption.

EXHIBIT A

BALLOT MEASURE FULL TEXT OF MEASURE

This proposition may be known and referred to as the Santa Ynez Valley Union High School District General Obligation Bond of 2012, or Measure ____

BOND AUTHORIZATION

By approval of this proposition by at least 55 percent of the registered voters voting on the proposition, the Santa Ynez Valley Union High School District (the "District") shall be authorized to issue and sell bonds of up to \$19,840,000 in aggregate principal at interest rates below the legal limit, to provide financing for the specific school facilities projects listed in the Bond Project List attached hereto as Exhibit A-1, subject to all the accountability requirements specified below.

BOND PROJECT LIST

The Bond Project List attached to this resolution as Exhibit A-1 shall be considered a part of the ballot proposition and shall be reproduced in any official document required to contain the full statement of the bond proposition.

Approval of this Bond Measure (the "Measure") does not guarantee that the proposed project or projects in the District that are the subject of bonds under the Measure will be funded beyond the local revenues generated by the Measure. If state matching funds become available, they will be used for and applied to the Bond Project List as per Exhibit A-1.

The school district's proposal for the project or projects may assume the receipt of matching state funds, which could be subject to appropriation by the Legislature or approval of a statewide bond measure.

ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

The provisions in this section are specifically included in this proposition in order that the voters and taxpayers in the District may be assured that their money will be spent wisely to address specific facilities needs of the District all in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3), of the State Constitution and the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000 (codified at Education Code Sections 15264 and following.)

<u>Evaluation of Needs.</u> The Board has prepared an updated facilities plan in order to evaluate and address all of the facilities needs of the District. The Board hereby certifies that it has evaluated safety, class size reduction, enrollment growth, and information technology needs in developing the Bond Project List contained in Exhibit A-1.

<u>Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee</u>. The Board shall establish an Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee pursuant to Education Code Section 15278 and following to

ensure bond proceeds are expended only on the school facilities projects listed in Exhibit A-1. The committee shall be established within 60 days of the date when the results of the election appear in the minutes of the Board.

<u>Performance Audits.</u> The Board shall conduct an annual, independent performance audit to ensure that the bond proceeds have been expended only on the school facilities projects listed in Exhibit A-1.

<u>Financial Audits.</u> The Board shall conduct an annual, independent financial audit of the bond proceeds until all of those proceeds have been spent for the school facilities projects listed in Exhibit A-1.

Special Bond Proceeds Account: Annual Report to Board. Upon approval of this proposition and the sale of any bonds approved, the Board shall take actions necessary to establish an account in which proceeds of the sale of bonds will be deposited. As long as any proceeds of the bonds remain unexpended, the Superintendent of the District shall cause a report to be filled with the Board annually stating (1) the amount of bond proceeds received and expended in that year, and (2) the status of any project funded or to be funded from bond proceeds. The report may relate to the calendar year, fiscal year, or other appropriate annual period as the Superintendent shall determine and may be incorporated in the annual budget, audit, or another appropriate routine report to the Board.

FURTHER SPECIFICATIONS

No Administrator Salaries. Proceeds from the sale of bonds authorized by this proposition shall be used only for the construction, reconstruction and/or rehabilitation of school facilities including the furnishing and equipping of school facilities or acquisition or lease of real property for school facilities and not for any other purpose, including teacher and administrator salaries and other school operating expenses.

The proceeds of the bonds will be deposited into a Building Fund to be held by the Santa Barbara County Treasurer, as required by the California Education Code.

EXHIBIT A-1

BOND PROJECT LIST

The specific school facilities projects to be funded at Santa Ynez High School include, but shall not be limited to:

- Replace and repair old and deteriorating roofs
- Repair/replace existing deteriorating plumbing, drainage, and sewer systems.
- Improve student access to computers and modern technology by updating technology and technology infrastructure throughout the campus; establish a technology endowment to support technology needs for the next ten years.
- Make health, safety, and security improvements including upgrading security cameras and lighting, replacing or upgrading fire alarm systems, fire safety equipment, and emergency systems including exit lighting improvements, and replacing campus wide-intercom and telecommunication systems
- Improve handicapped accessibility by making Federal and State-mandated Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility upgrades and as mandated by the Division of the State Architect (DSA) including site access, parking, restrooms, relocation of some existing electrical devices, drinking fountains, playground equipment, etc.
- Replace old and energy inefficient heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems.
- Improve energy-efficiency by installing cost effective building projects and sustainable building practices to promote energy-efficiency (e.g., windows, Energy Management Systems (EMS), HVAC, solar, electrical, lighting, etc.).
- Replace aging and deteriorating temporary portable classrooms.
- Modernize outdated classrooms, many that are now between 35-75 years old, including walls, sound, windows, ceilings, cabinets, doors and hardware, furniture, paint, carpet/vinyl, etc.
- Renovate and repair the 45-year-old swimming pool
- Replace inadequate electrical and wiring systems to meet current electrical and accessibility codes, increase capacity, and relieve currently overloaded electrical systems.
- Upgrade and renovate outdated restrooms and drinking fountains.
- Modernize, expand, repair and/or equip student support facilities and school exteriors, including the cafeteria, vocational education labs/classrooms, theater gymnasium, and other student support facilities.
- Upgrade and improve athletic playfields and facilities
- Resurface, repair, and/or replace paved surfaces, play court areas, turf, and other grounds to eliminate safety hazards and improve outside instructional areas.

Miscellaneous District Projects

- Abate and remove hazardous materials identified prior or during construction.
- Address unforeseen conditions revealed by construction/modernization (such as plumbing or gas line breaks, dry rot, seismic, structural, etc.).
- Other improvements required to comply with existing building codes, including the Field Act, and access requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- Necessary site acquisition and preparation/restoration in connection with new
 construction, renovation or remodeling, or installation or removal of relocatable
 classrooms, including ingress and egress, removing, replacing, or installing
 irrigation, utility lines (such as gas lines, water lines, electrical lines, sewer lines,
 and communication lines), trees and landscaping, relocating fire access roads, and
 acquiring any necessary easements, licenses, or rights of way to the property.
- Rental or construction of storage facilities and other space on an interim basis, as needed to accommodate construction materials, equipment, and personnel, and interim classrooms (including relocatables) for students and school functions or other storage for classroom materials displaced during construction.
- Acquisition of any of the facilities on the Bond Project List through temporary lease or lease-purchase arrangements, or execute purchase option under leases for any of these authorized facilities; purchase school facilities the District is currently leasing.
- For any project involving rehabilitation or renovation of a building or the major portion of a building, the District shall be authorized to proceed with new replacement construction instead, if the Board of Trustees determines that replacement and new construction is more economically practical than rehabilitation and renovation, considering the building's age, condition, expected remaining life, and other relevant factors.
- All work necessary and incidental to specific projects described above, including demolition of existing structures.
