Realigned Population

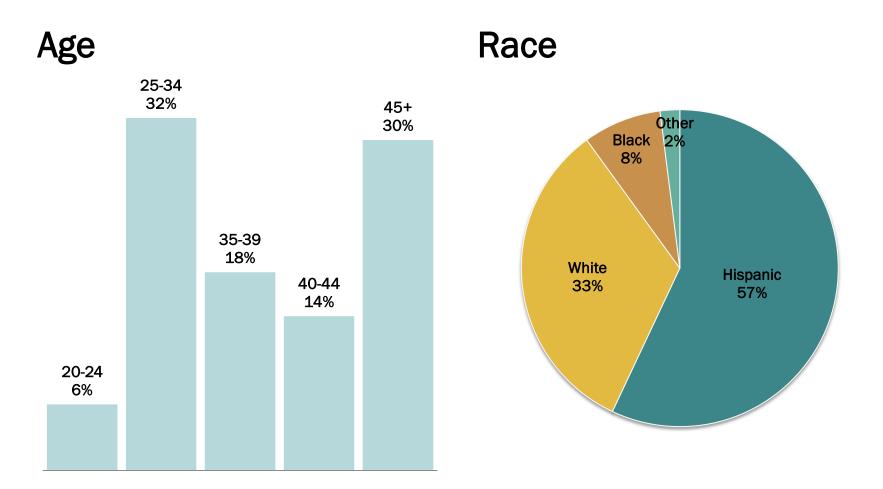
Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) offenders

- 279 projected (June 2018)

Post Sentence Supervision (PSS) offenders

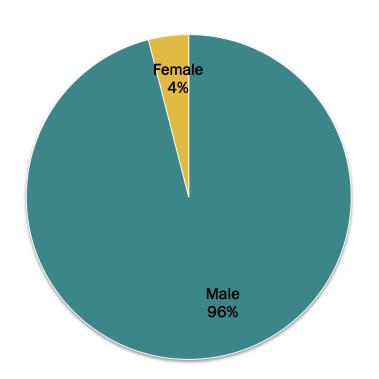
- Felony sentences served locally for non-violent, non-serious, non-sex offenders (NX3)

- 172 current (snapshot March 31, 2017)

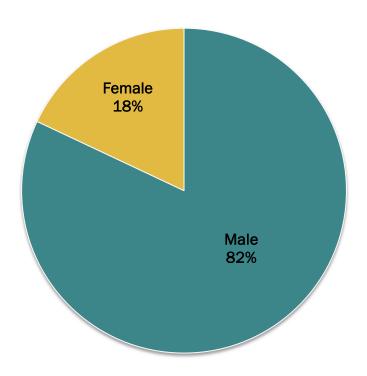

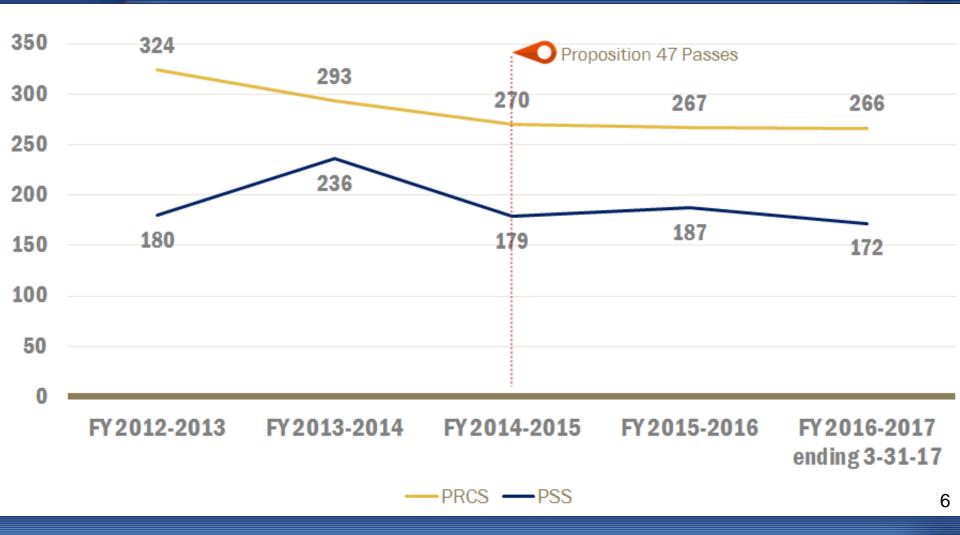
PRCS Gender

 - Analyze County's Realignment Plan and spending
 - Report recommendations to inform future budgets
- > May 2016: CCP affirmed selection of JFA Associates
- > June October 2016: Interviews and work performed
- > November 2016: Final Report received from JFA Associates
- > December 2016 January 2017: CCP Workgroup reviewed
 - Identified gaps highlighted in JFA Final Report
 - JFA recommended administrative and program development
 - JFA recommended re-allocations
