Recommended Actions:

- A) That the Board of Supervisors execute an agreement with the City of Santa Barbara for the period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012, for implementation of the Community Arts grant program, Community Events and Festival funding, Organizational Development grants, and staffing costs in the amount of \$427,260. And,
- B) Approve the Notice of Exemption pursuant to the County's California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines.

Summary Text:

The County of Santa Barbara is required to enter into an agreement each year with the City of Santa Barbara for the provision of various arts programs, which are administered by the County Arts Commission. This successful partnership, which has existed for the past 27 years, enable the City and the County to work together to deliver high quality art and cultural services to the community.

The attached agreement, upon execution by the Board, will implement the Community Arts grants program, Community Events & Festivals grant funding, Organizational Development Grants, and Arts Commission staffing costs for FY 2011-12, in the total amount of \$427,260.

Background:

This is the 27th consecutive year of the County's contractual arrangement with the City of Santa Barbara to provide funding for cooperative programs administered by the County Arts Commission. This annual agreement enables the City and the County working together as partners to deliver high quality art and cultural services to the community.

The City's contribution continues to leverage State and private funding that provides additional services to residents and visitors. Funding is provided for area of service and programs outlined in the contract.

Service elements include providing administrative resources and staff support for City arts committees, and the provision of technical assistance and training to artists, cultural organizations, and City agencies. Program elements include regranting of funds through the Community Art Program, the Events and Festivals Community Promotion Program, the Organizational Development Program, and the Cultural District Program.

The total amount of the grant agreement is \$427,260 and covers the period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.

Based on a preliminary review of the project the proposed action is determined to be exempt from further environmental review requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) of 1970, as defined in the State and County Guidelines for the implementation of CEQA. Section 15268 (a) MINISTERIAL PROJECTS (a) Exempts Ministerial projects from the requirements of CEQA review.
