RESOLUTION IN REMEMBRANCE OF THE TUCSON, ARIZONA SHOOTING VICTIMS

CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, on January 8, 2011 in Tucson, Arizona an act of violence was perpetrated that took the lives of six individuals and wounded thirteen others; and

WHEREAS, on January 8, 2012 at 10:00 a.m., the Santa Barbara Coalition Against Gun Violence led a local effort that joined communities throughout the country to remember the victims of the Tucson tragedy, especially those who lost their lives: Christina-Taylor Green, age 9, Dorothy Morris, age 76, Chief Judge John Roll, age 63, Phyllis Schneck, age 79, Dorwan Stoddard, age 76, Gabriel Zimmeran, age 30 and the 13 people wounded; and

WHEREAS, by joining a national vigil, residents across the country can come together to reflect upon the toll that gun violence takes on our families and neighborhoods and make a commitment to promoting peace and nonviolence in our cities and our communities; and

WHEREAS, the Tucson tragedy is an opportunity for local residents to support the mission of the Coalition Against Gun Violence which is to create a safer community by combating gun violence through educational activities and advocating for effective local, state and national programs, policies, and legislation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND RESOLVED that this Board of Supervisors joins communities throughout the Country in a day remembrance for the victims of the Tucson shootings and other gun violence tragedies.
