

Health Insurance Funding for Uninsured Children in Santa Barbara County





Medi-Cal Insurance	California's public health insurance program, serves families with incomes up to 200% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL)	Federal and State Funds
Healthy Families Insurance	California's public health insurance program for children whose families earn too much to qualify for Medi-Cal (up to 250% FPL)	Federal and State Funds
Healthy Kids Insurance	Serves children 0-18 regardless of immigration status, family income up to 300% of FPL	Locally Funded



- Children 0-18 regardless of immigration status living in Santa Barbara County
- Parents' income up to 300% of Federal Poverty Level (\$49,800 for a family of three)
- Identified through county-wide coordinated children's insurance outreach effort as needing care, but not eligible for Medi-Cal and Healthy Families



Why is it important to provide health insurance to all children?


Public health issue for the entire community:

An increased vulnerable population without healthcare puts all children at risk.




Lack of health insurance leads to:

- Incorrect use of expensive and already taxed Emergency Room services
- Reduced use of less costly preventive services such as immunizations or screenings, which can identify preventable chronic or serious conditions
- Medical treatment costs that are borne by Public Health Clinics




Of 1,200 children enrolled through the Santa Barbara County Healthy Kids outreach efforts, more than half (60%) were eligible for publicly funded insurance






What does Healthy Kids insurance provide?

- Medical, dental, vision and mental health coverage
- A medical provider for the family
- Coverage for preventive care for children, such as immunizations and wellness checks.





Premium cost of \$1346.04, plus an 15% administrative overhead rate for a annual cost / child of \$1548. MC/HF enrollments are estimates based on prior experience.
