Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Approve and authorize the Director of Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health to execute an amendment to the Substance Use Disorder revenue contract with the California Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs and State Department of Health Care Services for the period of July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2014 to add \$565,902 for a new maximum amount of \$22,482,944;

2. Determine that the above actions are government fiscal activities or funding mechanisms which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment, and are therefore not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to section 15378(b)(4) of the CEQA guidelines.

Summary Text:

The State Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) issued an amendment to increase the multi-year revenue contract for substance use disorder services, and update the agreement boilerplate contract language. ADMHS is required to execute and return the amendment to continue to receive reimbursement for substance use disorder services provided to residents of Santa Barbara County. Approval of the recommended action will approve and authorize the ADMHS Director to execute the amendment and receive Federal substance use disorder funds for FY 13-14.

Background:

The Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health Services (ADMHS) Department provides services to individuals with substance use issues primarily through contracted providers. The State ADP and DHCS agreement allocates Federal revenue to counties for the provision of substance abuse prevention and treatment services. This agreement includes Federal Drug Medi-Cal funding, as well as Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block grant funding. State revenue is allocated to ADMHS through the Behavioral Health Subaccount and is not reflected in the agreement. The State agreement provides the terms and conditions for reimbursement of alcohol and drug prevention and treatment services. ADMHS is mandated by the California Welfare and Institutions Code to provide services to individuals with substance use issues in Santa Barbara County.

ADP services, delivered through contracted service providers, include:

- Outpatient treatment services including individual and group counseling, and youth and family treatment programs.
- Residential detoxification provides a short term living environment to help clients safely withdraw from alcohol and/or other drugs and stabilizes clients to achieve abstinence from alcohol or other drugs.
- Perinatal treatment services including individual and group counseling for pregnant and parenting women, transitional living, and perinatal and residential programs services.
- Prevention Programs provide early intervention, outreach and mentoring services to youth at high risk for developing, or with existing, substance abuse issues. The majority of prevention funding is directed toward Primary Prevention strategies which address the entire population (national, local community, school, and neighborhood) with messages and programs aimed at preventing or delaying the abuse of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. Some Secondary Prevention services such as school-based counseling and mentoring are provided to individuals.

Approval of the recommended action will enable ADMHS and its subcontractors to continue to receive reimbursement for services provided to individuals with substance abuse issues throughout Santa Barbara County through June 30, 2014.

Key Contract Risks:

This contract with the State allocates Federal funds to ADMHS which are used to fund Alcohol and Drug Program services. The contract passes on to the County the responsibility to repay any audit exception taken by the Federal government, the State or the California State Auditor. The contract also imposes procedural and reporting requirements implemented by ADMHS that could be subject to audit in the future. ADMHS contracts include language requiring contractors to repay any amounts disallowed in audit findings, minimizing financial risks to County.
