SUBJECT: Bureau of Justice Assistance Local Law Enforcement Block Grants Program

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a. Authorize the County Administrator, on behalf of Santa Barbara County, to accept the 2002 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Funding in the amount of \$99,481 from the Bureau of Justice Assistance of the U.S. Department of Justice.
- b. Authorize the County Administrator to sign the County's application for grant funds, as well as all related contracts, amendments, or extensions with the Bureau of Justice Assistance, subject to Board of Supervisors approval.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation(s) are primarily aligned with Goal No. 2. A Safe and Healthy Community in Which to Live, Work, and Visit, and Goal No. 7. Strengthen the Safety and Well-Being of Children and their Families to Ensure a Strong Future for our Community.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

The Santa Barbara County Law Enforcement Agencies request that the County Administrative Officer be granted authorization to accept the 2002 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG) from the Bureau of Justice Assistance. This year's funds of \$99,481 will be spent to continue existing treatment services, implement ancillary services for the countywide Adult and Juvenile Drug Courts, and for Juvenile Drug Court staff to attend mandatory training.

LLEBG funds are designed to provide financial assistance for specified law enforcement "Purpose Areas", one of which is for the establishment or support of Drug Courts. The District Attorney, Sheriff, and Probation Officer have mutually agreed to continue to support the Adult Substance Abuse Treatment Court (SATC) and the Juvenile Drug Court (JDC) with their respective shares of this grant. The required 10% match will continue to be equally shared by the Sheriff, District Attorney and Probation Officer with asset forfeiture funds.

The grant requires an advisory board, which is fulfilled by the Therapeutic Justice System Policy Council. A monthly Core Committee meeting is also held with membership that includes staff from the District Attorney, Public Defender, ADMHS, Sheriff, community based treatment providers, Probation and Superior Court Judges. There is a unified commitment to continue providing services through a therapeutic jurisprudence model to Drug Court participants.

In summary, the LLEBG provides opportunity for ancillary services for the drug court participants and their families and necessary training for the Juvenile Drug Court team.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Acceptance of 2002 LLEBG funds requires adherence to standard federal grant requirements regarding submission of progress and financial reports, lobbying, audits, drug-free workplace, non-supplantation of funds, exclusion of violent offenders from the program, verification that persons employed by the recipient are eligible to work in the United States, suitable preference is given in the employment of persons to members of the Armed Forces who were separated or retired involuntarily due to reductions in the Department of Defense, and compliance with the Public Safety Officer's Health Benefits provision (PSOHB). Non-compliance with PSHOB will result in a 10% reduction in funding.

Drug Courts are not a specifically mandated service. However, certain rehabilitative services to Drug Court participants are mandated. The Probation Department is governed by numerous statutory mandates, which are attached for your review.

Performance Measures

The following Performance Measures appear in Probation Department Drug Court Programs:

0073 Ensure that 100% of babies born to clients in the Substance Abuse Treatment Court Program are drug free. (SATC had three births this last year and all three infants were born drug free)

0074 Ensure that 90% of the total number of clients enrolled each month remain drug free. (SATC has consistently reported at 89% or higher)

0089 Ensure that 80% of participants in Juvenile Drug Court will not have positive drug screens while in Aftercare. (During the past three quarters of the last fiscal year, 73% of the participants in Juvenile Drug Court remained drug free while in Aftercare.)

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

There will be no anticipated facility impact or county general fund contribution required.

There is however a "hard" match of \$11,053.00, which will be paid for with asset forfeitures contributed in equal shares by the Probation Department, the District Attorney's Office, and the Sheriff's Department. Probation asset forfeiture funds are located in fund 1420 "Probation-Asset Seizures".
