SUBJECT: Annual Health Inspection of Detention Facilities - 2005

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Receive and file the Summaries of Evaluation for Annual Health Inspections of Detention Facilities 2005 from the County Health Officer regarding compliance with environmental, nutritional and medical/mental health requirements for detention facilities throughout the County.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan: The recommendation is primarily aligned with Goal No. 2: Ensure a Safe and Healthy Community in Which to Live, Work, and Visit.

Executive Summary and Discussion: The County Health Officer is required to evaluate the health and sanitary conditions of detention facilities in the county on an annual basis. Reports detailing the results of the inspections have been provided to the administrators responsible for each facility and to the Corrections Standards Authority of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (formerly known as the Board of Corrections) which has jurisdiction over detention facilities. The Corrections Standards Authority refers to the health inspections as part of their own periodic inspections. Summaries of Evaluations have been provided to the Board of Supervisors, the Sheriff, the Chief Probation Officer and the Lompoc, Santa Maria and Santa Barbara police departments. As noted in the attached summaries, no serious deficiencies were noted, but some facilities were found to be in need of maintenance or minor structural improvements.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Section 101045 of the State Health and Safety Code requires the County Health Officer to conduct annual inspections of all publicly operated detention facilities and to submit a report to the Board of Supervisors, the Board of Corrections (now the Corrections Standards Authority) and the Sheriff or other person in charge of the detention facility. Section 1313 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 15, requires annual inspections of juvenile halls and camps.

The Santa Barbara Sobering Center is operated by Threshold to Recovery, a nonprofit organization, as an alternative to jail under contract with the City of Santa Barbara Police Department. Although most occupants are placed there by police officers, the sobering center is not a secured facility and has therefore been determined to not be subject to inspection by the Health Officer. Although it was included in the 2005 inspections, the Sobering Center will be dropped from the roster of detention facilities to be inspected in future years. PHD personnel would of course be available for consultation should the need arise.

Environmental Health Evaluation – Date Inspected: 11/22/2005

Policies and procedures for Article 1510- Facility Sanitation, Safety and Maintenance and Article 1511-Smoke Free Environment were not available during inspection. These policies were being implemented but were not documented in their manual. Policies and procedures manual was updated after the inspection to include these documents. Pool inspection revealed inaccurate recording of maintenance and chemicals, emergency phone numbers not posted and pool shell is in need of replastering.

All the nutritional requirements in accordance with Title 15 regulations have been met. The food service plan has not been completed at this time. Mr. Kelly is in the process of completing the last few sections of the food service plan.
