SUBJECT: Resolution Continuing Probation/District Attorney Narcotics Suppression Program

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

a. Adopt the attached resolution continuing the Probation/District Attorney Narcotics Suppression Program for fiscal year 2003-2004 authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to execute the grant agreement.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation(s) are primarily aligned with Goal No. 2: Ensure the Public Health and Safety and Provide Essential Infrastructure, and Goal No. 5: Maintain and Enhance the Quality of Life for all Residents.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

The Probation/District Attorney Narcotics Suppression Program has received funding from the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) for over ten years. The County Law Enforcement Chiefs and the Alcohol Drug Program Administrator are the grant's required Steering Committee responsible for determining how the Office of Criminal Justice Planning Anti-Drug Abuse grant funds available to Santa Barbara County are to be utilized. The Fiscal Year 2003/2004 allocation, upon approval, is \$288,452.

As stated in previous Board Letters, this project is a collaborative effort between all local law enforcement agencies to apply certain strategies designed to reduce the flow of narcotics through our county. The project uses searches, buy-bust operations, and street sweeps to accomplish the desired reduction of narcotics. It targets both street level dealers and major vendors operating within Santa Barbara County.

This year's funding will be used to offset the costs of one Deputy District Attorney IV, one Deputy Probation Officer, Sr. and one full-time Office Assistant III to be assigned to the Santa Barbara Regional Narcotic

Enforcement Team (SBRNET), as well as the costs associated with having a Peace Officer assigned to the Santa Barbara Regional Narcotic Enforcement Team by the Santa Maria Police Department, Lompoc Police Department, Guadalupe Police Department, and the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Department.

Performance Measures:

0076: To reduce criminal drug trafficking: Effect: 50 seizures of illegal substances.

0088: To hold offenders accountable and to enable the courts to make appropriate sentencing decisions within statutory deadlines: File 100% of 3,000 Adult Violation reports within statutory guidelines.

Mandates and Service Levels:

The project, as described, meets the guidelines set forth by the Office of Criminal Justice Planning. This is not a mandated program, although many of the services provided are mandated by statutes and court orders. Statutory mandates governing Probation Department services are attached for your review.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The FY 2003-2004 Probation/District Attorney Narcotics Suppression Program budget consists of expenditure appropriations of \$288,452 that were established during the County Budget process. The program expenditures are financed by \$288,452 in State Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) Anti-Drug Abuse Grant revenue account # 4789 (pass-through of federal funds). This is an increase of \$21,112 from FY 02-03 as well as to the 03-04 recommended budget. All of the increase will be equally distributed between the Santa Barbara County Sheriff and the City Police Departments. Additionally, \$9,886 in funds that the Santa Barbara Police Department had contributed to the Probation K-9 Program in FY 02-03 will not be available to Probation in FY 03-04.

The Probation/District Attorney Narcotics Suppression Program has no match requirement and does not cause the General Fund contribution to increase. The grant award prohibits the charging of indirect costs to the Office of Criminal Justice Planning Department by any agency involved in the program. However, the program is a multi-jurisdictional task force that operates outside of Probation offices resulting in negligible indirect costs to the county.

There are no facilities impacts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Chief Probation Officer of Santa Barbara County Probation is authorized to sign and approve on behalf of Santa Barbara County, the Grant Award Agreement, upon receipt, and upon approval of the Board of Supervisors, any extensions or amendments thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the applicant agrees to provide all matching funds required for said project (including any amendment thereof) under the Program and the funding terms and conditions of OCJP and that the cash match will be appropriated as required.

IT IS AGREED that any liability arising out of the performance of the Grant Award Agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the grant recipient and the authorizing agency. The State of California and OCJP disclaim responsibility for any such liability.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

IT IS ALSO AGREED that the award is not subject to local hiring freezes.
