

This section does not apply to the adoption of a plan that will have a legally binding effect on later activities. Additionally, CEQA Section 15061(b)(3) states that "the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to project which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment.

Reasons to support exemption findings: The grant funds for data collection and development of an Alternative Fuels Readiness Plan qualifies for an exemption under CEQA Guidelines Section 15262 as the project involves planning studies for identification of possible future actions that have not been approved, adopted, or funded by the County. Furthermore, the project provides no possibility to have a significant effect on the environment.
