SUBJECT: Resolution Authorizing Signatories to Obtain Financial Assistance Regarding

Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT)

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors adopt a Resolution authorizing certain employees to execute applications and documents for the purpose of obtaining financial assistance under the Governor's Office of Service and Volunteerism (GO SERV), which provides funding for the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) planning and program expenses.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation is primarily aligned with Goal No. 2. A Safe and Healthy Community in Which to Live, Work, and Visit.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

The Department of Homeland Security, through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is providing CERT program grants to states and territories through a FY 2003 appropriation. The Governor's Office of Service and Volunteerism (GO SERV) is California's point of contact for the CERT program. GO SERV provides these FEMA grants to local governments, tribal nations, and other organization.

The CERT grant allocation for Santa Barbara County is approximately \$14,496, with a performance period of December 5, 2003 to December 4, 2004. The funding provides up to one half personnel expense for authorized emergency planning staff, indirect costs, and some supplies and equipment.

Subject: Resolution Authorizing Signatories to Obtain Financial Assistance Regarding Community Emergency

Response Teams (CERT)

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The CERT program trains people to be ready to respond to emergency situations in their communities. When emergencies occur, CERT trained individuals are better prepared to take care of themselves and assist family members, neighbors, co-workers, and others. In emergencies, CERT teams can also provide valuable support to first responders, emergency management agencies and organizations like the American Red Cross. CERT teams can also help with non-emergency projects that increase community preparedness and safety. In the County of Santa Barbara there are approximately 250 people that have been CERT trained.

Current state guidelines require a resolution of signature attestation, which designates authorized officials for executing applications and documents for obtaining financial assistance under the Stafford Act (the "Act"). The Act provides for funding administered through GO SERV.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Federal guidelines in 44 CFR Part 302, Civil Defense; State and Local Emergency Management Performance Grant Programs, prescribe the requirements applicable to the GO SERV Program for federal financial contributions to the states, and through the states to their political subdivisions ("operational areas"), as subgrantees. The County is designated as the Santa Barbara Operational Area for emergency planning and response. While the County is not required to adopt an annual signature attestation resolution, it is advisable whenever there are personnel changes.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

This resolution allows County Fire/OES to apply for the file reimbursement claims under the GO SERV grant program through the Governor's Office of Service and Volunteerism (GO SERV). The GO SERV Program provides funding for development and/or enhancement of CERT programs in the County. The amount available through this grant is \$14,496 for the performance period of December 5, 2003 to December 4, 2004.
