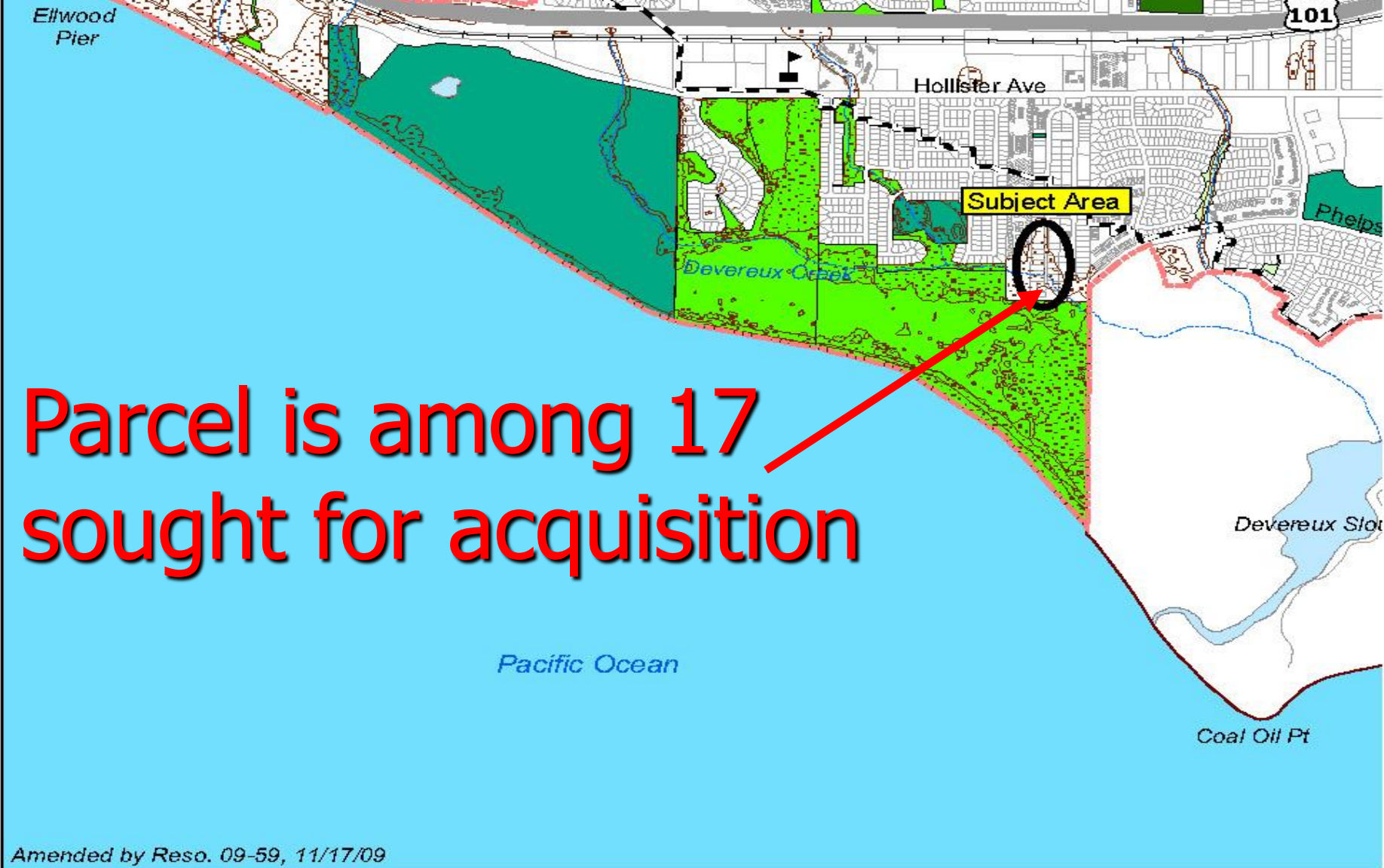

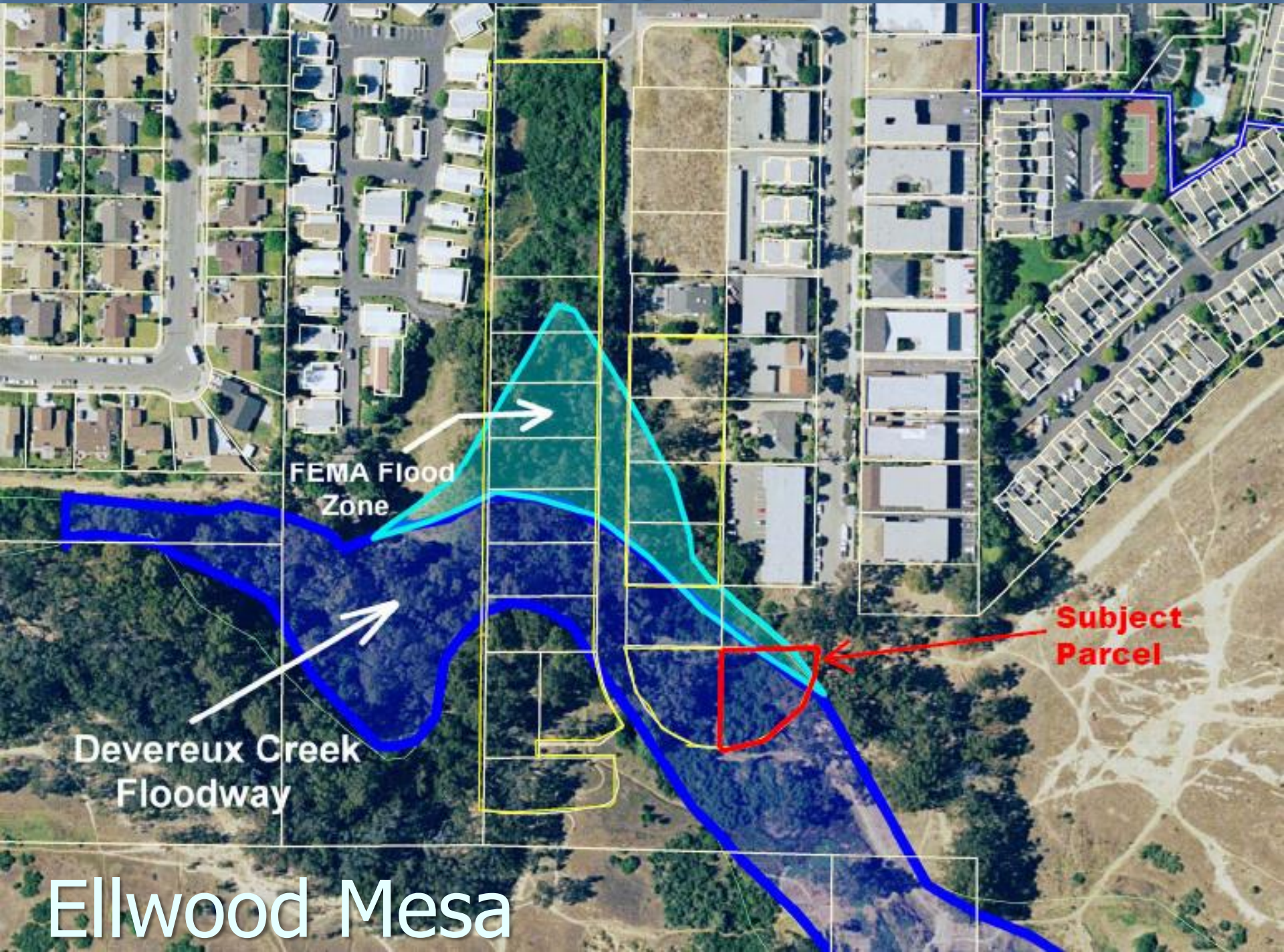
Looking South into Parcel

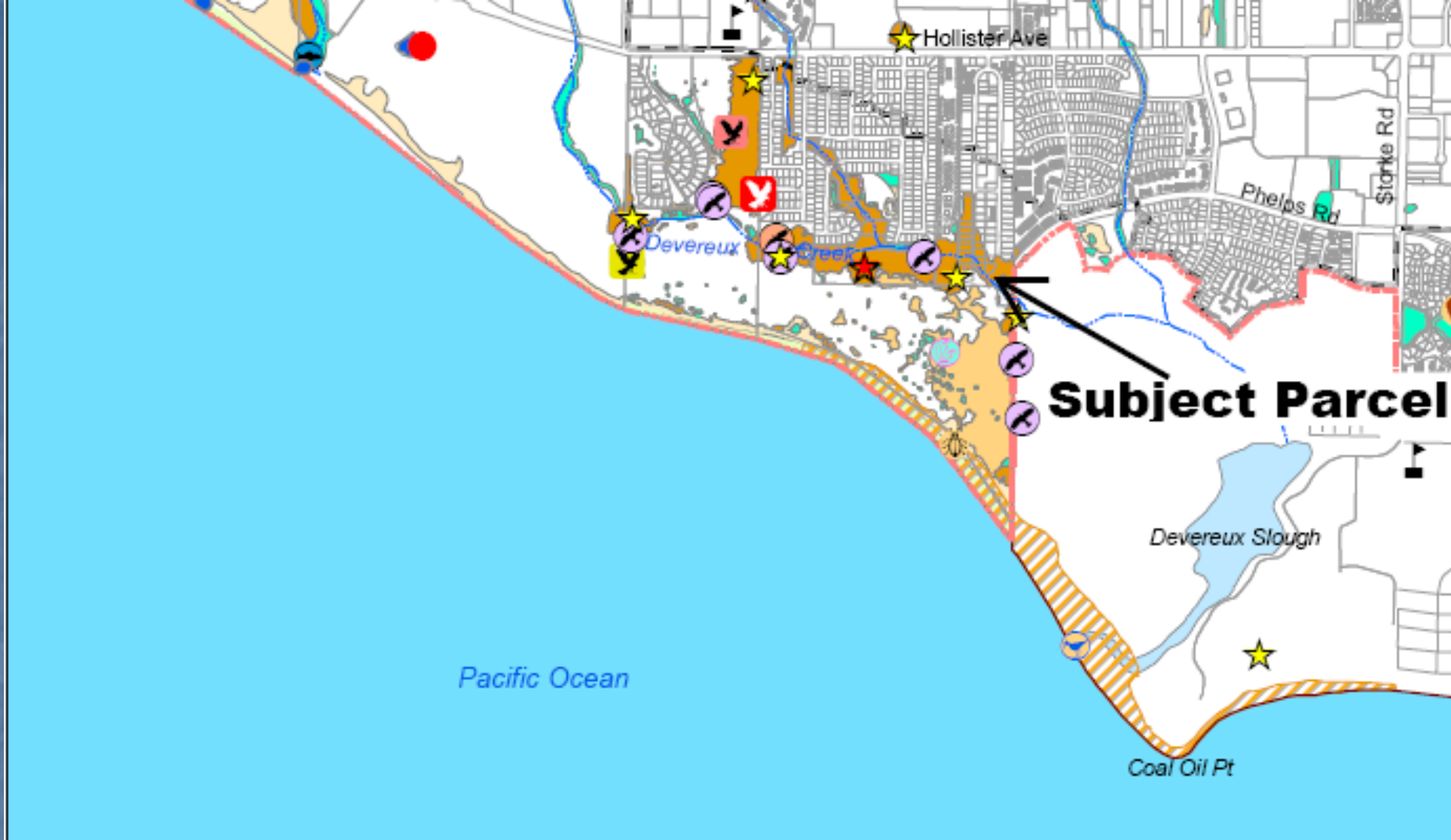

COASTAL ACCESS AND RECREATIONAL PLAN





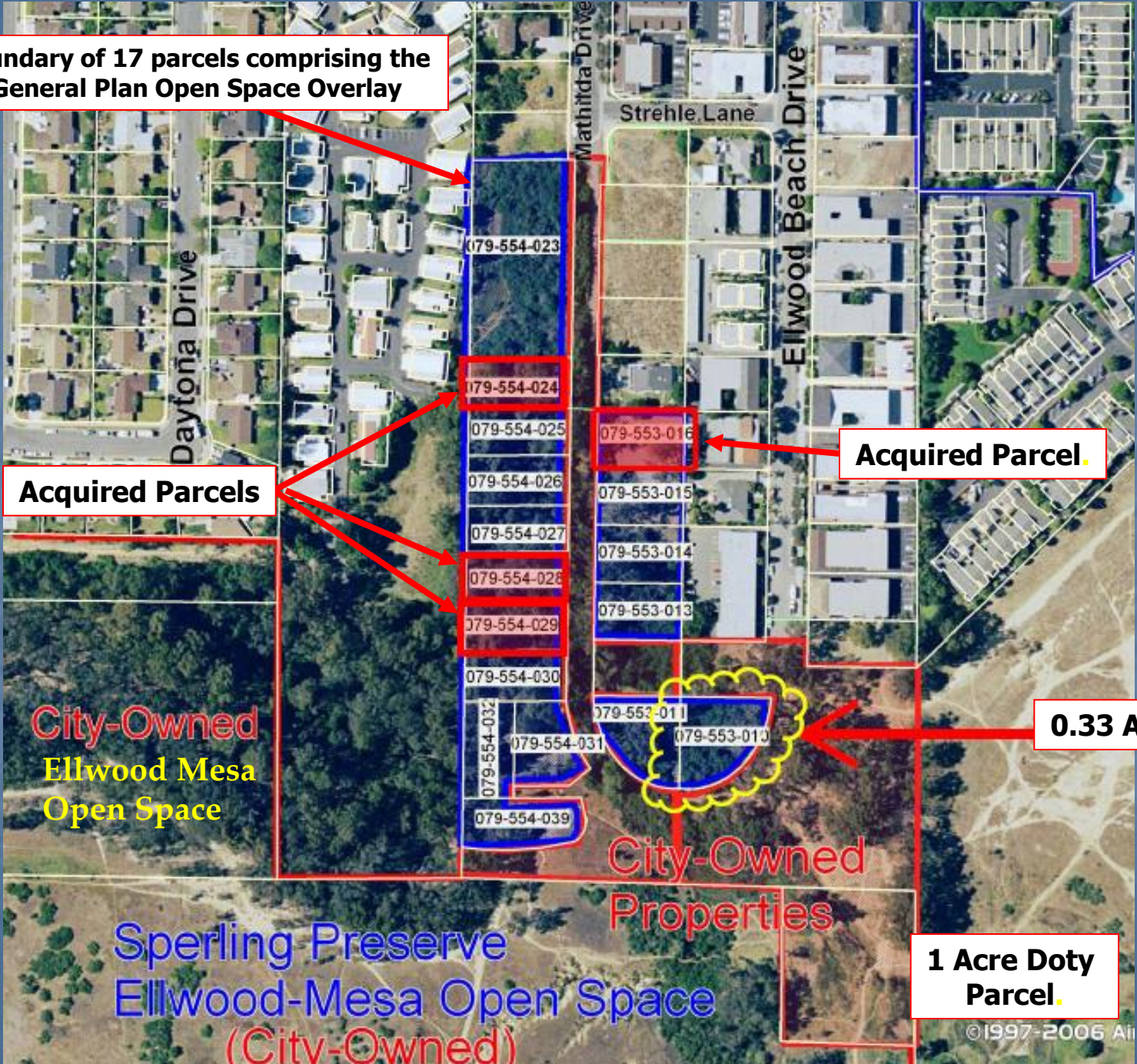
