## **Executive Summary:**

The Santa Barbara County Commission for Women, which was established in 1973, serves as a fact-finding body and to bring recommendations to the Board of Supervisors. For 2005 the following are being recognized: 1<sup>st</sup> District: Rape Crisis Center; 2<sup>nd</sup> District: Villa Majella; 3<sup>rd</sup> District: UCSB Women's Basketball Outreach Program; 4<sup>th</sup> District: Domestic Violence Solutions; 5<sup>th</sup> District: American Association of University Women, Santa Maria.
