

- Determine pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(5) that the proposed actions are not a project under CEQA


#### Cannabis Tax Revenue by Quarter






# State Licenses in Unincorporated Area

#### **Number of Active Cultivation Licenses by Region**



## State Provisional License Criteria

- Held a State Temporary License
- Submitted either
  - a) Permit application accepted for processing by P&D; or
  - Obtained a land use entitlement for the proposed cannabis operation and submitted a complete application for the corresponding cannabis business license
- Submitted an application and all required documents for State Annual Licensing

## State Licenses Due to Expire

227 licenses expiring within 60 days of today's report

Staff will review the status of those licenses to determine whether we continue to support their application

- 4 letters of intent to withdraw local authorization issued
  - 1 Applicant surrendered provisional licenses
  - 2 Applicants mitigated identified problems
  - 1 Applicant appealed decision

# CDFA Track-and-Trace Pilot Program

- CDFA has developed a pilot program for a small number of counties to access the Trackand-Trace database
- County would gain access to the inventory records associated with 250 State licenses located in Santa Barbara County

#### Critical to:

- Initiate Board-directed tax compliance audit
- Perform compliance and enforcement activities
- Staff recommends Board approval of MOU with CFDA to participate in pilot program

## **Emerging Issues**

- Provisional License Review Process
  - Satisfactory progress through the land-use permitting process
  - Enforcement actions (yes/no)
  - Filed quarterly tax reports as required
  - Documented community complaints charging fraudulent affidavits
- Initiate the Retail Outlet selection program
- Bring land-use permitting and business license process into closer alignment
- Need to support those operators who are striving for full compliance

#### Challenges

- Carpinteria Overlay: Odor issues remain the major challenge
  - Identifying the source of the odor
  - Ascertaining the most effective technology
- North County: Interface with EDRNs
- Scope expansion with respect to Legal Non-Conforming Growers

- Cannabis legal review
- Cannabis Enforcement team modifications
