
For The Past 20 Years Our Jail System Has Been Seriously Overcrowded


Case Study - Serena

- Age 9, went to Juvenile Hall for Stealing And Drinking
- Age 13, went to Juvenile Hall and then California Youth Authority for Stabbing a woman 7 times
- Age 20, went to Jail for Burglary and Vandalism
- Age 22, went to Prison for Sale Of Drugs
- Other Arrest include DUI, Home Invasion Robbery, Battery, and Gang Activity
- In County Jail 25 times





Create a Jail Overcrowding Prevention Commission

Create A Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC)

- Consists Of Department Heads From The Criminal Justice System
 - Courts
 - Sheriff
 - District Attorney
 - Chief Probation Officer
 - Public Defender
 - County Executive Officer
 - Private Criminal Defense Attorneys
 - Senior representatives of Local Law Enforcement



Cost of Construction and Operation

Cost to County of a 300-bed jail facility Without a SCRF:

\$ 80.0 million

Construction Cost of a combined 300-bed Jail and SCRF:

Amount paid by State:

Net Capital Cost to County

\$ 230.0 million (208.0 million)

\$ 22.0 million

Operating Cost of 300-bed Jail:

Less State (5/8 of common facility operating costs of \$5.3 m/yr)

Net County jail operating cost

Plus Prevention costs (@50%)

Total Net County operating costs:

\$ 15.0 million/yr

- 3.3 million/yr


