Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute a contract with Community Action Commission to provide an Independent Living Program for Child Welfare Services/Probation youth for the period 7/1/09 through 6/30/10 at a cost not to exceed \$185,000.
- B. Authorize the Director of the Department of Social Services to approve amendments to the proposed contract provided that any such amendments do not exceed 10% of the contract's dollar amount.
- C. Authorize the Director of the Department of Social Services, at her discretion, to negotiate a renewal for up to one (1) additional year of service beyond the initial term to the aforementioned contract. The terms of the renewal will be subject to renegotiation, based on performance measures and satisfaction with services provided.

Summary Text:

Through a competitive bidding process, the Department of Social Services selected Community Action Commission (CAC) to provide a creative service delivery approach for the Independent Living Program (ILP) which serves both Child Welfare Services and Probation youth. Program oversight will continue to be provided by the Santa Barbara County Department of Social Services ILP Coordinator.

The goal of the ILP is to enable youth, ages 16-21 to achieve self sufficiency prior to leaving the foster care support system and through the continuum of emancipation. The program encompasses preparation case management and learning activities in the following seven Independent Living Skill areas: Education, Employment, Daily Living Skills, Survival Skills, Inter-personnel/Social Skills and Computer/Internet Skills.

This contract contains a clause that allows for termination by the department with 30 days notice in the event funding from any source is diminished or becomes unavailable.

Background:

Santa Barbara County Department of Social Services is held accountable by the State to comply with the California Manual of Policy and Procedures Division 30 and 31 ILP regulations. These regulations necessitate ILP services to provide learning activities in the seven ILP skill areas: Education, Employment, Daily Living Skills, Survival Skills, Choices & Consequences, Interpersonal/Social Skills, and Computer/Internet Skills. In addition, the Santa Barbara County ILP includes an Aftercare Program designed to specifically meet the unique needs of youth ages 18 up to 21 who have emancipated from the foster care system. Services to be provided under this Agreement are in conformance with California Manual of Policy and Procedures Division 30 and 31 Regulations.
