Dear Board of Supervisors,

The Legal Aid Foundation of Santa Barbara County supports the proposed merge of Bringing Our Community Home (The Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness), the Homeless Advisory Committees, and Common Ground Santa Barbara.

It is critical that we streamline and improve cross-sector coordination of homeless services in Santa Barbara County. As the 2010-11 Grand Jury Report on Homeless Mentally Ill Indigent Recidivism illustrates, there is an identified need for centralized coordination among public and non-profit resources in order to more effectively prevent and reduce homelessness in our community.

The Legal Aid Foundation of Santa Barbara County is focused on preventing homelessness and assisting with income maintenance to move people out of homelessness. As part of the proposed reorganization we will be involved in this collaborative effort by participating in the coordinating committee. We believe that the new structure establishes a clear avenue for members of the public and concerned advocates to provide direct input to policymakers at the Leadership Council meetings during public comment.

We urge you to take the necessary steps to make changes to existing ordinances or create new ones to codify this new structure; and to find matching funds in the coming fiscal cycle for the







County's share to establish the centralized infrastructure and dedicated staffing for this effort.
