Material processing to occur in the back canyon of the landfill



Urgency Ordinance creating a New Tip Fee for Debris Flow

Recommendations:

- By a 4/5th Vote, Approve the Urgency Ordinance to establish a new fee of \$55.00 per ton for mixed debris loads of dirt, rock and trees at the Tajiguas Landfill
 - And adoption of the Urgency Ordinance is exempt from CEQA
