Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Services

Funding Recommendations to be Considered by the County Board of Supervisors on May 5, 2020

The Allocations Committee of the Human Services Commission met on Friday, February 7 to review applications for FY 2020-21 CDBG Public Service funding and make funding recommendations based on projected available funds. The Committee also recommended that, if the actual CDBG Public Services funding amount is greater than the projected amount by less than \$10,000, the additional funds will be divided evenly between the top three ranked applications, which are WillBridge's Emergency/Transitional Housing Program, Domestic Violence Solutions' Domestic Violence Victims Shelter, and Good Samaritan Shelter's Bridgehouse Emergency Shelter. The Department of Housing and Urban Development released the County's CDBG funding amount on Friday, February 14, and the Committee's recommendations were revised accordingly.

Applications for the City of Carpinteria's share of CDBG Public Services funds (listed in italics below) were reviewed by the City's CDBG Committee, which recommended that the city's funds be divided evenly between the two applicants. This recommendation was approved by the Carpinteria City Council on Monday, February 24.

Final funding awards will be made by the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday, May 5.
