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## Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

Authorize the Director of Public Works to advertise for construction the Tajiguas Landfill Access Road Realignment, County Project No. 720684 (Solid Waste project No. 828349).

## Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendations are primarily aligned with Goal No.2 to ensure the public's health and safety.

## Executive Summary and Discussion:

The Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for this project was certified on August 13, 2002, the Revised Waste Discharge Requirements were obtained on March 21, 2003 and the Revised Solid Waste Facilities Permit was obtained on April 23, 2003. As part of the expansion project it is necessary to stockpile excess soil. To allow for stockpiling, the access road will need realignment at a cost of \$150,000.00. The realignment is consistent with the EIR and we have continued to work with the regulatory agencies on the development of the project.
