PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Approve and authorize the Statement of Final Quantities for work performed and materials supplied for this project by the Contractor, Windsor Fuel Company of Pittsburg, California in the amount of \$2,884,422 for project Number 820621. This project is a scrub seal and micro-surfacing strategy the Department employs in its annual Pavement Preservation Program. Scrub seals start with application of polymer modified asphaltic rejuvenating emulsion to the existing road. Then a broom is pulled across the emulsion filling cracks and voids. Next, aggregate is spread on the emulsion and rolled by pneumatic tire compactors. The following day microsurfacing is placed on top of the scrub seal. Micro-surfacing is a mixture of polymer modified asphalt emulsion, mineral aggregate and filler.
