Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the attached Amendment No. 1 (Attachment A) to the Coastal Resource Mitigation Fund contract with the Channel Islands Marine & Wildlife Institute (Attachment B) to amend the Project Description, Project Budget and Project Schedule (Exhibit A of Attachment B) and extend the Contract period to December 31, 2025, All Districts (Attachment A).
- b. Determine that amending the Coastal Resource Mitigation Fund grants are exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15378(b)(5) of the State Guidelines for the implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act.

Summary Text:

This item is before the Board because the grant recipient is requesting an extension and modifications to their grant contract. Attachment A contains Amendment No. 1 to the contract with the Channel Islands Marine & Wildlife Institute (CIMWI), allowing for minor revisions to the original Agreement's Project

Description and Project Budget, and extending the Time of Performance date (Article 3) from December 31, 2022 to December 31, 2025.

CIMWI requested a time extension as it explained that their volunteers did not have as much time as intended to devote to the overall development and completion of the project. In addition, project team members also ended up leaving CIMWI for other full-time opportunities. CIMWI has completed the 10 educational lesson plans but has not moved forward on remaining aspects of the project. The minor project and budget amendments focus on: 1) hiring a professional to translate the lesson plans into Spanish, 2) hiring a professional for the art and graphic design to support the curriculum and marketing package, 3) hiring professionals for the film script development and film production, and 4) producing three films instead of ten to accompany the lesson plans. CIMWI originally had matched the CRMF award with \$9,800 in in-kind services and for the Amended Project, it has secured approximately an additional \$1,000 of in-kind services. Attachment A attaches Amendment No. 1 to the original Agreement (Attachment B).

Executing a CRMF Amendment does not meet the definition of a "project" pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(5). This section exempts administrative activities of governments that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment.

Background:

On August 17, 2021, the County executed a contract with CIMWI, providing a \$33,929 CRMF grant towards CIMWI's online marine conservation education program which focuses on elementary school children (grades K-5th grade) throughout Santa Barbara County and beyond.

The County established CRMF to mitigate the environmental impacts of offshore oil and gas development and transportation projects. Mitigation is provided through CRMF for impacts to four categories of coastal resources: coastal recreation, tourism, aesthetics, and environmentally sensitive resources. The County must ensure that CRMF fees are used to mitigate those impacts, according to conditions of approval on projects and the CRMF Guidelines.

Fiscal Analysis:

There is no increase in the original CRMF grant award to CIMWI.

CRMF creates no fiscal impact on the County General Fund budget. CRMF is funded by mitigation fees paid annually by developers of offshore oil and gas reserves. Funding for CRMF is budgeted in the Planning & Development Department's Coastal Mitigation Budget Program on page D-316 of the County of Santa Barbara Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24 Adopted Budget, and is fully supported by funds in CRMF.

Administration of the CRMF includes updates to the annual status report, solicitation and evaluation of grant proposals and recommendation of grant awards to the Board of Supervisors, preparing, monitoring and enforcement of CRMF grant contracts, preparation and monitoring of the CRMF budget, and reassessing CRMF fees.

Key Contract Risks:

Risk analyses of the Amendment in Attachment A determined that the Amendment would be a low risk: the Amendment is not increasing the contract amount; the complexities of the Amendment and Contract requirement are low; and the Amendment and Contract are not controversial.
