#### **Summary:**

On May 11, 2006, the Civil Grand Jury released a report on the state of the County's preparedness for winter storms. The report includes 5 findings and 2 recommendations. On June 9, the Public Works Department responded to all findings and recommendations. The Board was requested to respond directly to Finding 5 and Recommendation 1. Additional information on recommendation 1 has become available since the Public Works Department's response and is provided in a separate response from the Board. It is recommended that the Board adopt the both the response of the Public Works Department and the additional Board of Supervisors' response to Recommendation 1 as its response to the Grand Jury report.

#### Background:

Per California Penal Code Section 933 (b), the governing body of the agency, the Board of Directors, must respond within 90 days after the issuance of the Grand Jury Report. Therefore, the Board of Directors' response must be finalized and transmitted to the Presiding Judge of the Courts no later than August 8, 2006.

#### Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

There are no fiscal or facility impacts associated with setting the hearing or responding to the Civil Grand Jury. Several of the recommendations contained within the report have fiscal and facility impacts.
