Recommended Actions:

Approve and authorize the Chair to execute Amendment No. 2 to the Agreement with Kennedy/Jenks Consultants (not a local vendor) to administer and coordinate Proposition 50 Grant Project submittals to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) by extending the term of the agreement from April 1, 2011 to December 31, 2013 and to increase the contract amount by \$85,000 to a not to exceed amount of \$296,031.

Summary Text:

On November 11, 2008, the Board entered into an agreement with Kennedy/Jenks Consultants to conduct services necessary to administering the Proposition 50 Grant awarded by the SWRCB to 14 water related projects County-wide. Services performed by Kennedy/Jenks included the development of a web based tool that allows the project participants to upload and track submittals required for reimbursement from the SWRCB. In addition, Kennedy/Jenks compiles and submits quarterly invoices to the SWRCB. Kennedy/Jenks Consultants have proven to be very effective in performing Proposition 50 grant invoicing and related tasks on behalf of the County and Project Proponents.

The Water Agency anticipated amending this agreement with Kennedy/Jenks on an annual basis for the grant's 3 year term or until all 14 projects are completed. However, during the first two years of the grant's term no additional funding was necessary and only a term amendment was secured. The term of the grant is now being modified to include an extension through 2013 and this contract amendment is anticipated to cover contract costs through the end of the new grant period and provide for completion of

all Prop 50 submittals. This amendment will extend the period of the contract until December 31, 2013 and increase the contract by \$85,000.

Background:

Beginning in September 2006, the County Water Agency worked with a County-wide group of cities, special districts, water companies, and joint powers authorities to develop the first Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (completed in May 2007).

Pursuant to the Water Security, Clean Drinking Water, Coastal and Beach Protection Act of 2002 (Water Code Section 79560 et seq.), on behalf of the 29 agencies who cooperated in the preparation of the IRWMP, the County Water Agency applied for and was granted \$25 million in funding for 14 water related projects within the County.

As authorized by the Water Agency Board of Directors on December 11, 2007, the Water Agency acts as the single eligible grant recipient responsible for administration of the Proposition 50 Grant. In accordance with the existing MOU and subgrant agreements between the Water Agency and Project Proponents, the Water Agency functions as a pass through agency between the State and Proponents. The Water Agency is responsible to organize and forward the required project reporting information and to review and submit claims to the State from each Project Proponent and reimburse the Project Proponent once funding is received from the State.
