SUBJECT: **Temporary Parking Restrictions on Various Streets due to the Jesusita Fire, 1st & 2nd Supervisorial Districts**

Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors adopt two Resolutions and approve Notice of Exemptions pursuant to the County's California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) guidelines for the establishment of temporary no parking zones, to be rescinded within six months, on:

- Tunnel Road in the Mission Canyon area; 1st Supervisorial District
- San Roque Road in the San Roque Canyon area; 2nd Supervisorial District

Summary Text:

Requests were received from the Mission Canyon Association and residents in the San Roque Canyon area to assist in the rebuild efforts due to the Jesusita fire.

Based upon our investigation, the Public Works Department has prepared the attached Resolutions (2) establishing temporary no parking, to be rescinded within six months, at the following locations:

ADOPT

No Parking Zone

- On the east side of Tunnel Road from Spyglass Ridge to Valencia Avenue
- On both sides of San Roque Road within the County jurisdiction from a point 150 feet south of Jesusita Lane to a point 1650 feet south of Jesusita Lane

Background:

Parking restrictions are either established or rescinded based on safety, necessity and how it relates to community usage as a whole. All of these factors are weighed by the Public Works Department and any changes recommended are presented to the Board of Supervisors for approval. These parking restrictions may include no parking, time limited parking, loading zones, vehicle height restricted parking, angle parking, handicapped parking or any combination of these restrictions.

The Jesusita Fire, which began May 5, 2009 in San Roque Canyon, strongly affected both San Roque Canyon and Mission Canyon. The request for temporary no parking zones was initiated by citizens of San Roque Canyon and by the Mission Canyon Association. There was concern with safety due to a rise in traffic volumes and the presence of heavy equipment associated with construction and debris removal from the Jesusita Fire.

While progress is being made by private property owners and the County to quickly clean up the affected burn areas, temporary no parking areas, to be rescinded within six months, will further expedite the clean up process.
