1. Objective:

The objective is to perform airfield pavement resurfacing through a variety of strategies including, crack fill and seal, a pavement seal coat, along with an application of new pavement markings.

2. Benefits Anticipated:

Address the distressed condition of existing airfield pavements, exhibiting raveling (generation of FOD), and weathering, thereby preserving the long term value and safe, functional aspect of each pavement feature. PCI: 68

3. Approach: (See approved Scope of Work in Final Application)

Construction will proceed after the Sponsor successfully receives a federal grant. It is anticipated the construction and closeout effort will take 180 calendar days. All construction should be complete by May, 2026.
