#### **Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Directors of the Santa Barbara County Flood Control and Water Conservation District:

- (a) Approve the attached "Notice of Exemption" pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) guidelines regarding the acceptance of an Easement Deed granting access a portion of 899 Concha Loma Drive (APN 001-070-031) to Carpinteria Creek; and
- (b) Accept an Easement Deed from the owners of the above referenced property by authorizing the Clerk of the Board to sign the Certificate of Acceptance attached thereto.

#### **Summary Text:**

If accepted and recorded the Easement Deed will grant to the Santa Barbara County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (herein the "District") the right to cross a specific portion of the property commonly known as 899 Concha Loma Drive (herein the "Subject Property") to gain access to Carpinteria Creek.

# **Background:**

The owners of the Subject Property constructed a single family residence thereon. As a condition of that construction the owners were required to grant the Easement Deed to the District. District staff have reviewed and approved the Easement Deed and the physical area of the Subject Property used to access Carpinteria Creek. If accepted and recorded the Easement Deed will formalize the District's ingress and egress rights across the Subject Property.
