Recommended Actions: That the Board of Supervisors:

Adopt the attached resolution authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to submit, sign, and accept the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) in the amount of \$52,210 for the period July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, from the California Corrections Standards Authority (CSA).

Summary Text:

At their April 1, 2011, meeting, the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) met and agreed that the FY 11-12 grant should be used to fund services to minors participating in the three Juvenile Drug Court (JDC) programs, alcohol and drug group counseling in the Santa Maria Juvenile Hall (SMJH), and to provide Teen Court/Peer Review services countywide.

Background:

The Probation Department has received Juvenile Accountability and Incentive Block Grant funds from the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) since FY 1999-2000. The Federal Government renamed the grant program the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) during the FY 2004-2005 application period. Hereafter, the program will be referred to as JABG regardless of the fiscal year. The seventeen eligible program purpose areas have remained unchanged.

Since January 2002, JABG funds have been consistently utilized. Program Area 8, "Juvenile Drug Courts", includes the provision of services to minors participating in the County's three JDC programs and for continued alcohol and drug group counseling in the SMJH for JDC participants who are detained. Teen Court/Peer Review case management of minors in the three geographic regions of the County is also funded under Program Area 11, "Accountability".

Since program inception, the Board of Supervisors has annually approved the resolution authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to apply for and disburse the JABG grant funds from CSA.

Performance Measure:

The Performance Measures for the JDC Program are:

- Ensure at least 65% of youth in the JDC graduate successfully. Since July 2007, 140 of 264 youth (53%) have successfully completed Juvenile Drug Court.
- Ensure that at least 80% of Juvenile Drug Court graduates do not have a new felony or misdemeanor referral within six months of graduation. Between July 2007 and July 2010, of 121 youth successfully exiting Juvenile Drug Court, 114 (94.2%) did not get referred for a new felony within six months and 109 (90.0%) did not get referred for a misdemeanor within six months.

The Performance Measure for the Teen Court Program is:

Ensure that at least 80% of Teen Court graduates do not have a new felony or misdemeanor referral within six months of graduation. Since July 2007, of 1095 youth successfully exiting Teen Court, 1061 (96.9%) did not get referred for a new felony within six months, and 988 (90.2%) did not get referred for a misdemeanor within six months.

The JABG funds ongoing Probation Department programs and is used to purchase contracted services or activities. The originally projected grant allocation, required match, and program expenditures are included in Probation's FY 2011-2012 proposed budget. FY 2011-2012 grant funded expenditures, including the required 10% match of \$5,801, totals \$58,011. \$35,688 will fund core components of the JDC program. \$14,923 will fund Teen Court/Peer Review activities. \$7,400 will fund alcohol and drug counseling in the SMJH. There is no increase in General Fund contribution due to this grant.

There will be no anticipated facility impacts. The project will use existing facilities.

WHEREAS, the County of Santa Barbara desires to undertake a project designated as the Juvenile Accountability Program and to receive and utilize federal grant funds available through the Juvenile Accountability Block Grants (JABG) Program administered by the Corrections Standards Authority (hereafter referred to as CSA).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Chief Probation Officer of the Santa Barbara County Probation Department is authorized on behalf of the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors to submit the JABG application to CSA and upon Board of Supervisors approval is authorized to sign and approve the Grant Award Agreement with the CSA, including any extensions or amendments thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that County of Santa Barbara agrees to provide all matching funds required for said project (including any amendment thereof) under the Program and by the funding terms and conditions of CSA and that the cash match will be appropriated as required, and will abide by the statutes and regulations governing the JABG program as well as the terms and conditions of the grant agreement as set forth by the CSA.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.
