AB 1014 – Gun Violence Restraining Orders

July 1, 2014 Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors



Existing Law

- Regulates, sales, transfers, possession & ownership of firearms
- For example, persons subject to a DV protective order are prohibited from owning or possessing a firearm if prohibited by order
- Requires law enforcement to take temporary custody of a firearm at the scene of DV incident
- Require DOJ to request admission records from mental health institutions



AB 1014 would...

- Authorize courts to issue an *ex parte* gun violence restraining order on a person, upon showing good cause, from owning, purchasing, possessing a firearm or ammunition
- Establish fourteen-day expiration of ex parte order
- Require person to be served with order, if locatable
- Allow restrained person to request a hearing
- Authorize court to issue a gun violence restraining order for one year with convincing evidence of significant risk of injury to self or others



AB 1014 would...

- Require restrained person to surrender firearm to law enforcement
- Require court to notify DOJ and local DA of order
- Make violation of restraining order a misdemeanor and prohibit the owning or possessing a firearm for five years from expiration of order
- Make false reporting/petitioning a misdemeanor
- Allow warrant-based searches for firearms possessed by a restrained person and requires law enforcement to take custody of same



AB 1014 would...

 Require DOJ to only use mental health institution's admission information to determine eligibility for gun violence restraining order



Options for Board Action

Option 1

- a. Take no position on AB 1014, and
- b. Find that the proposed actions do not constitute a "Project" within the meaning of CEQA.

Option 2

- Take an advocacy position (support, watch or oppose) on AB 1014,
- b. Direct staff to forward, and authorize the Chair to sign, a letter stating the Board's position , and
- Find that the proposed actions do not constitute a "Project" within the meaning of CEQA.
