The Superintendent may determine in writing that a particular consultant, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that are limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements described in this Section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Superintendent's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code.

EXHIBIT "B"

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of investments, business entities, sources of income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, or real property which the Designated Employee must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned.

<u>Category 1</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income located in, that do business in or own real property within the jurisdiction of the Districts.

Category 2: All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the jurisdiction of the Districts.

<u>Category 3</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the Districts.

<u>Category 4</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are banking, savings and loan, or other financial institutions.

<u>Category 5</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Districts.

<u>Category 6</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Designated Employee's Department.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA BARBARA SCHOOL DISTRICTS AMENDING THE APPENDIX OF THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE PURSUANT TO THE POLITICAL REFORM ACT OF 1974

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California enacted the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code Section 81000 et seq. (the "Act"), which contains provisions relating to conflicts of interest which potentially affect all officers, employees and consultants of the Santa Barbara School Districts (the "Districts") and requires all public agencies to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Districts adopted a Conflict of Interest Code (the "Code") which was amended on May 16, 2006, in compliance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, subsequent changed circumstances within the Districts have made it advisable and necessary, pursuant to Sections 87306 and 87307 of the Act, to amend and update the Appendix of the Districts' Code; and

WHEREAS, the potential penalties for violation of the provisions of the Act are substantial and may include criminal and civil liability, as well as equitable relief which could result in the Districts being restrained or prevented from acting in cases where the provisions of the Act may have been violated; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public meeting on, and of consideration by the Board of Education of, the proposed amended Appendix was provided each affected designated employee and publicly posted for review at the offices of the Districts; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held upon the proposed amended Appendix at a regular meeting of the Board of Education on November 18, 2008, at which all present were given an opportunity to be heard on the proposed amended Appendix.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Santa Barbara School Districts that the Board of Education does hereby adopt the proposed amended Appendix of the Conflict of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be on file with the Coordinator, Certificated Personnel, and available to the public for inspection and copying during regular business hours;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said amended Appendix of the Conflict of Interest Code shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara for approval and said amended Appendix shall become effective 30 days after the Board of Supervisors approves the proposed amended Appendix as submitted.
