Executive Summary and Discussion:

The Santa Barbara County Children and Families Commission consists of nine regular and four alternate members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. One regular member is a member of the Board of Supervisors and three regular members are "County Members" selected from among the County Health Officer, and Director of Social Services, Director of Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health Services and Director of Probation. One alternate member is a member of the Board of Supervisors and one alternate member is the remaining "County Member" that is not appointed as a regular member.

Mandates and Service Levels:

The members of the Children and Families Commission will be required to devote a substantial amount of time attending Commission meetings, monitoring and evaluating existing grants, and evaluating future funding proposals.
