d) Determine that these activities are exempt from California Environmental Quality Act review per CEQA Guideline Section 15061(b)(3), since it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activities may have a significant effect on the environment; and CEQA Guideline Sections 15307, and 15308, because these actions are for the protection of natural resources and the environment.

Consider recommendations regarding a Fourth Amendment to the Oregon Community Health Information Network (OCHIN) Master System Agreement, as follows:
